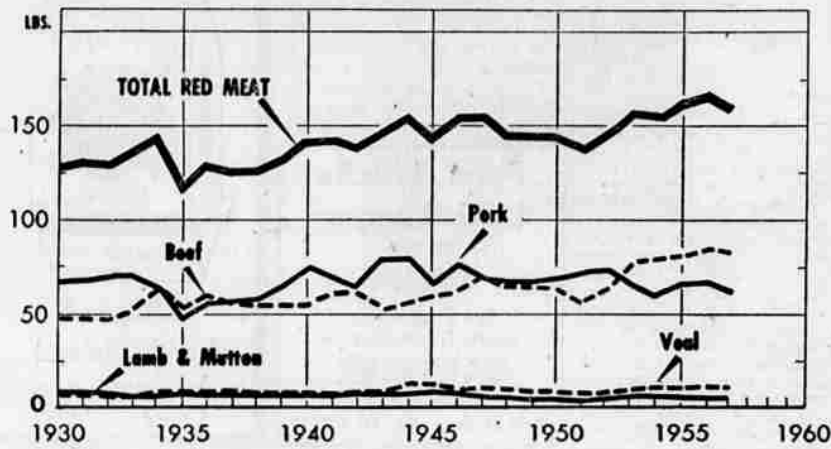


RED MEAT CONSUMPTION PER PERSON

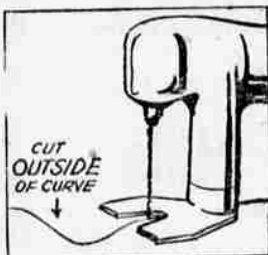

CONSUMPTION OF PORK per person, as of all meat, increased during the 1930's and the war years. Since the war, however, pork consumption has declined slowly, as beef and veal made up all the increase for total meat consumed.

HOME REPAIR DO's And DON'T's

DO . . . know that many home repairs around the house can be made easier with the use of a portable jigsaw, since it can make cuts in wood or other materials which are anchored to something else, unlike the otherwise valuable stationary power tools.

DO . . . start a cut with the portable jigsaw by placing the forward edge of the base on the stock,



starting the motor and then moving the blade forward with a firm but not excessive pressure.

DO . . . cut freehand to a scribed line or use a straightedge, depending on how important it is to cut a perfect cut . . . but be sure the straightedge is thick enough so the base of the saw does not ride over it.

DO . . . when cutting outside curves, saw along the outside edge of the design, thus allowing a little leeway to fix any slight mistake you might have made.

DON'T . . . forget that there are many kinds of blades available to enable the portable jigsaw to be used for cutting both ferrous and non-ferrous metals, as well as wood, felt, leather, rubber, plastics, insulating materials, composition boards, linoleum and resilient floor tiles.

DON'T . . . overtighten the blade in the chuck unless you want it to break off the first time there is any extra-stain on it.

DON'T . . . try to cut hardwood over one inch thick unless you have one of the special heavy-duty model jigsaws.

DON'T . . . make any adjustments on the machine while the electric plug is in the outlet; it is not enough merely to turn off the switch.

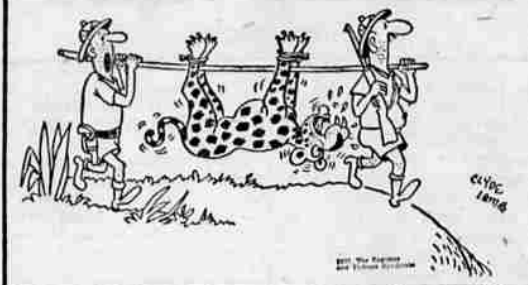
PRECIOUS SHERRY
