Shortly after David started to school, I
was watching him come home one day when
I saw two other boys knock him down
about a block from our house. He got to
his feet and started on, only to be knocked
down again. When he approached our
corner, his assailants dropped discreetly
behind. He said nothing about the incident,
but I watched for several days, and each
day the procedure was repeated.

When I finally took him aside and ques-
tioned him, he admitted the attacks. So I
spent several days showing him how to
fight. When the boys jumped him again,
he fought back but was badly outnum-
bered. At this point, my wife stepped in.

"Seems like we should talk this over with
God," she said. "If we really believe that He
created all men, then He created these boys,
too, and they can only express His qualities
of love and brotherhood. Let's expect these
things from them—and remember the
Golden Rule. Oh, yes, and why don't you
