HONOLULU (UP)—A veteran newspaper photographer and an airplane pilot were rescued by a Navy helicopter Sunday from a beach on privately owned Niihau Island where their Piper Cub made a forced landing Saturday. Warren Roll, formerly a photographer with the Independent Journal at San Rafael, and pilot Joseph Prigge escaped injury in the forced landing, but the plane's propeller and undercarriage was wrecked. Cmdr. L. Price of the Navy said he found the damaged plane on the beach.

Safe Driving Program Set

A nationwide safe driving program cited by the National Safety Council and featuring world-famous race driver lecturers will be given students of Klamath Union High School on November 22, 1957.

Fred Agabashian, who began his career on California tracks at the age of 17 and has raced in the famed Indianapolis Speedway classic 11 times, will conduct the lecture-demonstration. He is one of a team of six famed race drivers currently visiting the nation's schools.

These track veterans have taken their expert safety instruction to nearly a half-million students since early 1956. More than 1,400 schools throughout the 48 states will have been visited by the lecturer-drivers at the end of the current school year.

The National Safety Council Public Interest Award was recently presented the Champion Spark Plug Company of Toledo, Ohio, for developing and maintaining this highway safety program in public schools. The visit here has been arranged by Ballou and Wright and Colyear Motor Sales. Citing the program for its objective, constructive, and completely noncommercial flavor, educational and civic and law enforcement officials have given it unqualified written endorsement.

Agabashian points out how safety on the race track relates to everyday highway driving. He illustrates his talk with a film and flannel-board demonstration, addresses driver-training classes and inspects student cars for defects upon request.

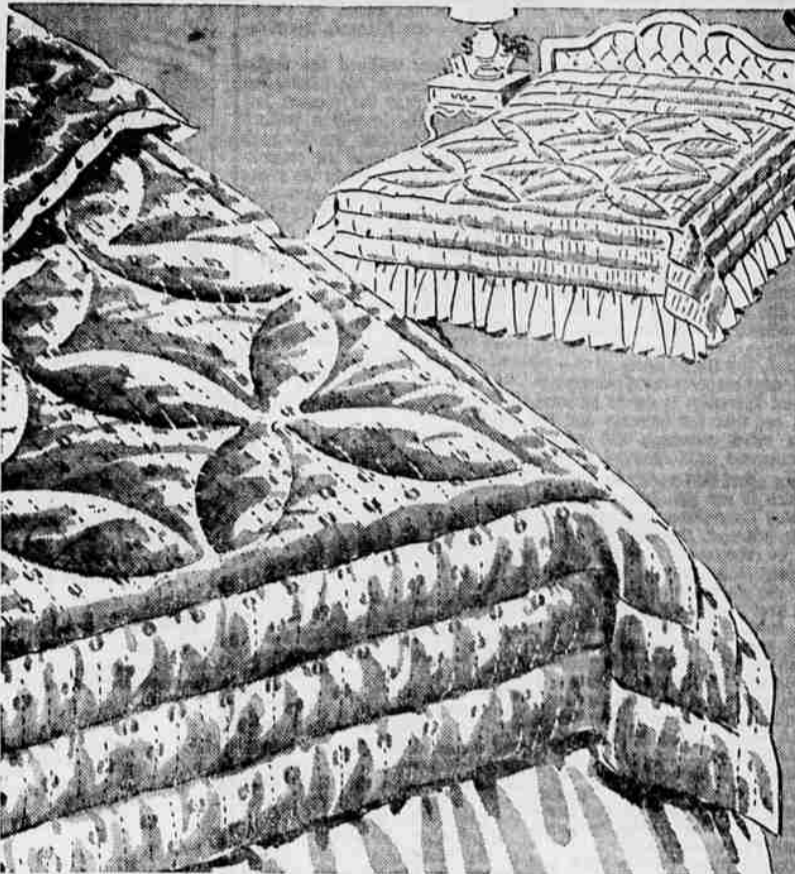

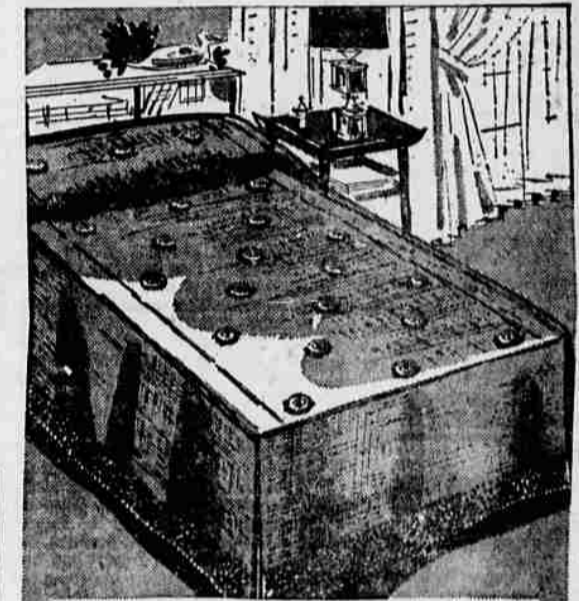

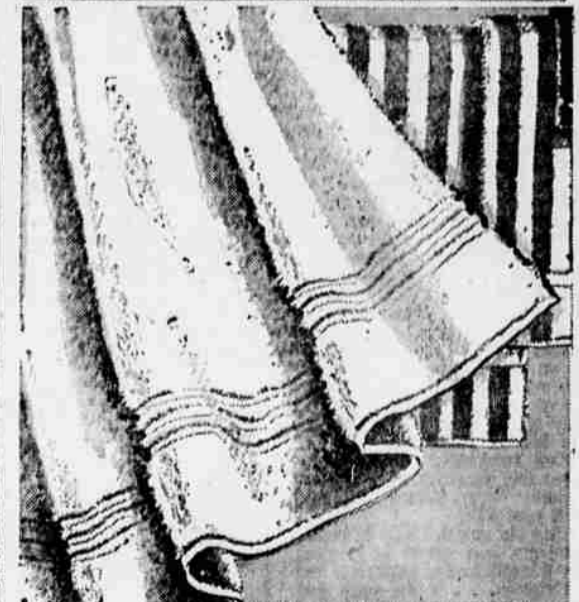
