TV Method Ban Sought

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP)— The National Assn. of Radio & Television Broadcasters code review board for TV asked stations yesterday not to use a method that flashes commercials to the viewers' subconscious.
The idea has been created quite a furor. Don Martin, assistant to the president of NARTB, said that by this method a message is flashed at 1-3000th of a second, and repeated every five seconds during the showing of a movie. He said the viewer does not even see the message, or at least is not conscious of seeing it, but it does reach his brain.
The board held that "any proposal to use... 'subliminal perception' be referred to the board immediately for further review and consideration."

Residents Flee Widening Hole

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)— A gaping hole in a North End boulevard widened rapidly for a time early today and police ordered 60 persons to be ready to evacuate their homes at a moment's notice.
The huge hole, caused by a sewer break Monday, was more than 70 feet deep. Its edge crumbled away at the rate of about a foot a minute for a brief period prior to 1 a.m. so that the hole's top measured approximately 200 feet by 100 feet.
When the rapid crumbling ceased, the lip of the huge crater was only nine feet away from the foundation of the nearest home, one of nine threatened. Also in jeopardy was a five-unit apartment house.
The hole developed in a neighborhood of homes in the \$15,000 to \$20,000 class a few blocks north of the University of Washington campus.
Water, backed up in sewers, was threatening other streets. Police said they were considering closing off Roosevelt Way, a main north-south arterial, because there were indications the ground beneath that street also was giving way.
