

Union Hails Court Ruling

MILWAUKEE (AP)—A labor union spokesman indicated a major advance for organized labor could come out of a verdict by a U.S. District Court jury which decided yesterday that union benefits paid a striker are tax-free gifts and not taxable as income.

Emil Mazey, Detroit, secretary-treasurer of the United Auto Workers, hailed the verdict saying that it is upheld "an important precedent for all labor will have been established. This decision is a vindication of our position that strike relief . . . is not subject under the law to federal income taxes."

Max Raskin, Milwaukee, attorney for the union, said the decision will have an important bearing on similar court tests involving millions of dollars.

The verdict came as an outgrowth of the strike by Local 833 of the UAW against The Kohler Co. of Oshkosh, Wis. The UAW has poured more than eight million dollars in striker assistance in the strike, oldest major labor dispute in the country. The strike began as a contract dispute in April 1954. The plumbing wage firm returned to production about two months later with new workers and non-strikers.

Raskin said the United Steelworkers and the United Electricalworkers have filed similar cases that are awaiting trial in Pittsburgh and St. Louis. He said they involve millions of dollars.

A jury of seven men and five women decided that \$565.64 paid to Allen Kaiser of Sheboygan, Wis., in 1954 while he was on strike at Kohler was not subject to income taxes. Kohler brought the suit to recover \$108 in taxes paid after the benefits were assessed as income by the Internal Revenue Service, acting under a ruling unchanged since 1922.

Leland T. Atherton, a federal attorney from Washington, claimed the verdict was not consistent with the evidence. He asked the verdict be set aside and a new trial ordered.

AEC Opens New Office

TOKYO (AP)—The U.S. Atomic Energy Commission today opened its fourth overseas office to advise foreign governments on peaceful use of atomic energy.

W. Herbert Pennington of Quarryville, Pa., said the new Tokyo office he heads will provide consulting services and implement U.S. atomic power agreements with Japan, Nationalist China, the Philippines, South Korea, Thailand, New Zealand and Australia.

Similar AEC offices were opened a year ago in London and Paris and two weeks ago in Buenos Aires. Pennington's assistant at the office in the U.S. Embassy is Paul A. Roessler of Santa Fe, N.M.
