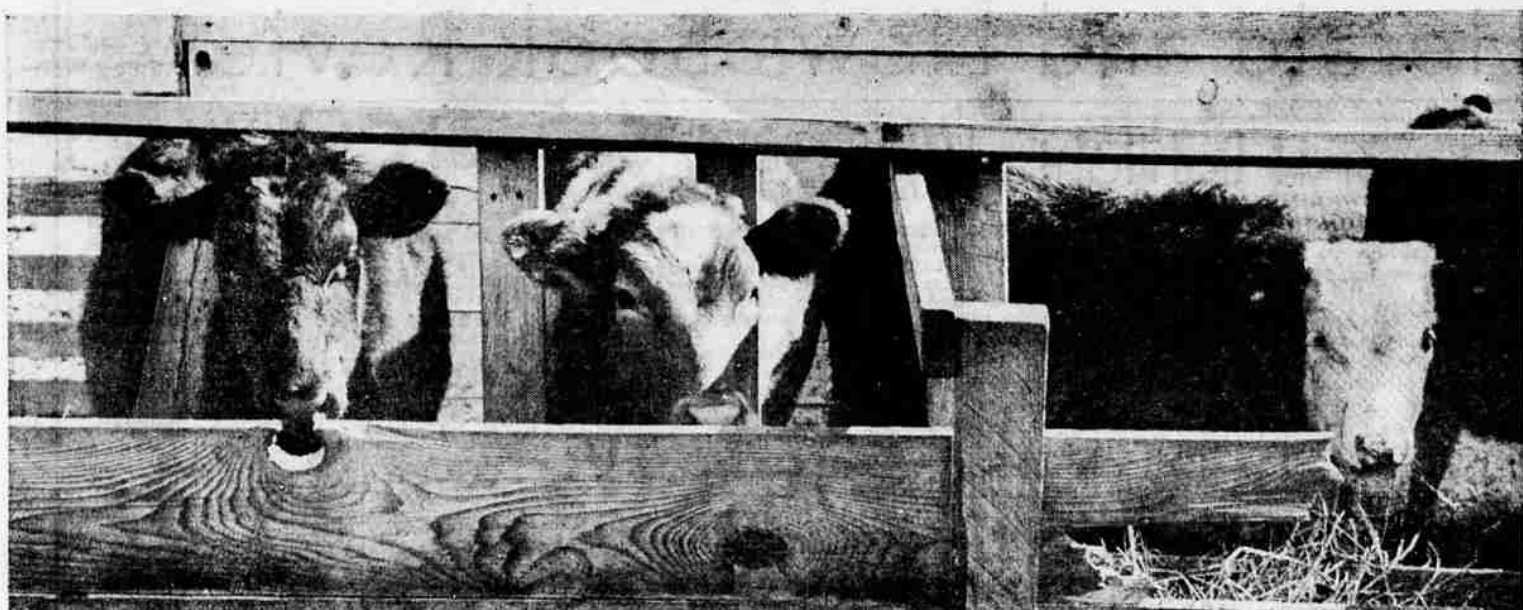




Milkmaids come young on the Jerry Sayles Grade "A" Dairy!
