Negro Leaders Across South Drive To Gain Vote Strength

WASHINGTON (UP) — Negro leaders are directing the civil rights controversy away from the congressional arena and into the polling places of the southern states.

Southern white Democrats probably must shift their attention from the schools to the ballot boxes if they are to meet this new trend. Regardless of the merits of the controversy, the Negro strategy appears to be sound and promising.

Rep. Charles C. Diggs Jr. (D-Mich.) is a Negro who knows about politics. He recently counseled his race, as follows: "The South is misguided by white politicians competing with each other. The only language a politician understands, especially a southern politician, is the ballot."

Foreign Aid Program Hit

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Passman (D-La.) said today the country's foreign aid program needs more thinking, planning and hard work and "less golf."

"I am opposed to the theory that we can cure all ills with money," said Passman, chairman of the House Appropriations Subcommittee which handles the foreign aid money bills.

Noting reports that next year's budget request for foreign aid might again be in excess of four billion dollars, Passman said in an interview, "There is absolutely no justification for an increase."

The administration last year asked about \$4,400,000,000 for foreign aid, but Congress voted only about \$3.4 billion. There have been reports that the request for next year has been fixed tentatively at \$4,200,000,000.

Passman, a long-time foe of excessive foreign aid spending, contended that "appropriations are not the answer. We could confiscate all the wealth of the country for foreign aid and still not have enough to finance all the desirable projects around the world."

"We need more thinking, hard work and less golf."

"I believe that elected officials should give more attention to the duties they're elected to do and that golf and recreation should be pushed to the background until the present crisis is resolved," he said.

Passman recently returned from a trip around the world during which he inspected workings of the foreign aid program in 17 countries.

"I am more firmly convinced than ever that this is not the approach to our problem," he said. "I've seen enough to convince me that the way the program is operating is rather like pouring water down a rat hole."

"With all our spending I don't think we have made a friend. In fact, in some places they're even mad because we don't give them more."
