Park To Mark Anniversary
 Today, November 21, the Lava Beds National Monument will observe the 32nd anniversary of its establishment.

The monument was established November 21, 1925, by proclamation by President Calvin Coolidge. Originally placed under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Forest Service, Department of Agriculture, it was transferred to the National Park Service, Department of the Interior, on June 10, 1933.

Approximately 60,000 persons a year visit the monument, which is open the year around. It was the principal theater of the Modoc Indian War of 1872-1873, and also contains unusual exhibits of ancient and comparatively recent volcanic activity. The monument is becoming increasingly important as a wildlife sanctuary, and during winter months thousands of mule deer winter there.

Improved interpretive services, roads, trails, and related facilities for the benefit and enjoyment of the visitors are scheduled for Lava Beds National Monument under the Mission 66 program of the National Park Service.

HOLLYWOOD (UP)—A brand new motion picture process, modestly named "Cinemiracle," was unveiled this week. It's a Cinema-rama-like gimmick that overwhelms audiences with sheer bigness.

Cinemiracle provides more three-dimensional effect than Todd-AO, VistaVision or Cinema-

Scope, and improves some of the technical facets of Cinerama. A three-camera process requiring a trio of projectors and special sound equipment, Cinemiracle is the best of big screen efforts to date.

Demonstration of the jumbo process was presented in the Melrose Theater, a defunct popcorn palace which folded when television stomped on the scene.

In a speech preceding the showing, Elmer C. Rhoden, president of National Theaters, Inc., looked around the shabby theater and said, "We hope that Cinemiracle can prevent this sort of thing from happening in the future."

As developer of the new method Rhoden claims his machine affords wall-to-wall, floor-to-ceiling viewing for the first time in movie history.

"The screen can go as high and wide as a theater allows," he told the Hollywood press corps. "There's no fixed ratio of height to width."

The experimental screen in Hollywood is 24 feet high, 63 feet wide. A demonstration screen in New York is 34 by 81 feet and 16 feet deep. Projection covers a field of 146 degrees wide and 55 degrees high—approximately that of human vision, which is 160-60 degrees.

Cinemiracle gives a clear picture from any vantage in the theater—no blurring or distortion. Viewers really feel "in" the picture, a disconcerting phenomenon at times.

through Philadelphia on a hook and ladder fire truck and a crash dive via submarine. Whenever the camera plunges unexpectedly it takes the viewer's stomach with it.

"Falling attendance and business setbacks in motion pictures resulted from not putting enough money back into research," Rhoden says. "When we sent letters to producers explaining our new development only Jack Warner gave us any encouragement."

Because of his interest Warners will film the second feature using Cinemiracle. It is fittingly titled "The Miracle."

The first picture is Louis de Rochemont's "Cinemiracle Adventure," a travelogue epic filmed around the voyage of a Norwegian windjammer and her crew, scheduled for release next March.

So optimism again flows in the jaundiced veins of movietown, but the big-wigs are reminded that a good movie with top stars will make money no matter what size the screen.
