LANGELL VALLEY — Shelby (Curley) Robinson former Langell Valley resident died near Fortuna, California, on November 13. He was a logger there and when going to work in the morning apparently suffered a heart attack and his car went into a creek. The accident happened one-half mile from his home. His widow, who survives, is the former Ethel Welch, sister of Ivan Welch of Langell Valley. He also leaves two daughters, two sons, his mother and three brothers.

Ceylon Faces New Strikes

COLOMBO, Ceylon — A fresh wave of labor unrest spread across strike-troubled Ceylon Monday. A strike threat by a Communist dockworkers union alarmed political leaders.

Within hours after a settlement was reached in a strike of postal and telegraph workers, 750 workers in Colombo's boat yards walked out in a demand for higher wages. In East Ceylon 775 workers on a government project stopped work in protest against the firing of a fellow worker. The Communist-controlled harbor workers union threatened to call out its dockhands this week and to persuade others to join in a sympathy strike.

Brig Beating Policy Related

YOKOSUKA, Japan — An Alabama Marine sergeant charged with cruelty towards Navy prisoners admitted Monday he beat two sailors and a fellow leatherneck "to run a better brig."

Sgt. Tommy G. Flint, 23, Silas, Ala., former warden in the brig at Sasebo Naval Base in southern Japan, said roughing up the prisoners was regular policy and the brig officer was aware of it. The accused Marine, one of 16 being court-martialed for alleged maltreatment of prisoners, said the brig officer, Capt. Milton C. Kramer, told him, "I know what's going on down here . . . If it is going on don't let me know about it."

No charges have been filed against Kramer who supervised the Marine-run jail. Officials declined to disclose his hometown.

REITERATES CHARGE

NICOSIA, Cyprus (UP)—The English-Language newspaper Cyprus Mail Sunday repeated its report that a British officer warned that his men would fire on young Cypriot children if they did not stop hounding him. An official spokesman had denied the newspaper's statement that the officer commanding British forces in the village of Akantou threatened to open fire or clamp on a curfew unless the children stopped making the derisive sounds.

WASHINGTON (UP)—House Republican leader Joseph W. Martin Jr. (Mass.) has proposed the federal government foot the bill for scientific training of five top-ranking students each year in each of January.
