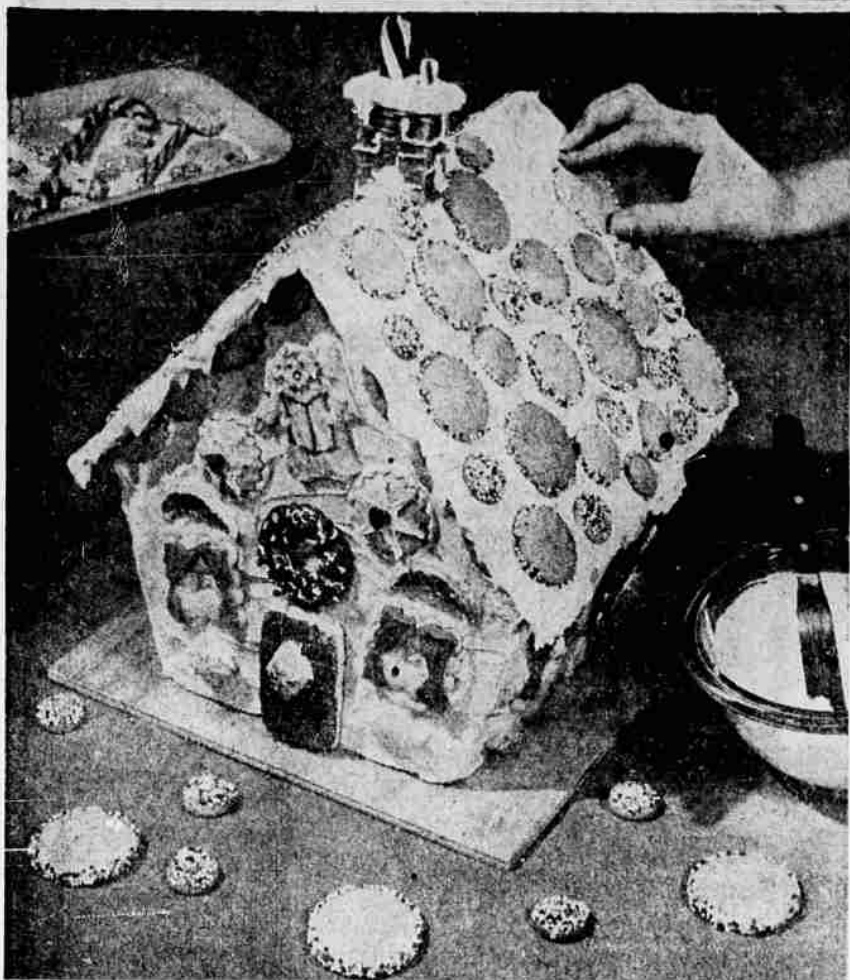

Make and decorate the cookies, then cover the frame with fluffy white frosting, a small area at a time, press in cookies, and your house is ready for a garland of greens or snow.

Your cookie decorations create the character of this fairy tale Hansel and Gretel house. Make doors and windows from cookies... icicles from the frosting. Even tint the frosting for a colored house or dust it with red colored sugar for a holiday mood.

**RECIPES FOR COOKY HOUSE MERRY CHRISTMAS COOKIES**  
(for windows, doors, sides of house)

1-3 cup soft shortening  
1-3 cup sugar  
1 egg  
2-3 cup honey  
1 tsp. lemon flavoring  
2-4 cups sifted Gold Medal Flour  
1 tsp. soda  
1 tsp. salt  
Mix shortening, sugar, egg, honey and lemon flavoring thoroughly. Sift flour, salt, and soda together and stir in. Chill dough. Roll out 1/4 inch thick. Cut into desired shapes for doors, windows, and sides of house. Place 1 inch apart on lightly greased baking sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes, until, when touched lightly with finger, no imprint remains. When cool, ice and decorate with butter icing.

**CARAMEL RAINBOW REFRIGERATOR COOKIES**  
(for roof)

1/2 cup soft shortening (part butter)  
1 cup brown sugar (packed)  
1 egg  
1/2 tsp. vanilla  
1-4 cups sifted Gold Medal Flour  
1/4 tsp. salt  
1/4 tsp. soda  
Mix shortening, sugar, egg, and vanilla. Sift flour, salt and soda and stir in. Form into different
