Fire Crews Gain On Blaze

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Fire fighters reported today that they were making steady progress in efforts to control the 25,000-acre San Gabriel Mountains forest fire. The wind died during the night and the humidity rose, conditions which greatly aided the fire-fighting force of 1,400 men working along a 25-mile perimeter of the huge fire burning to a considerable extent in almost inaccessible terrain. In some of the most rugged sections where the fire was burning within itself, crews were given a rest during the night because the terrain is so rough their work could not be effective in darkness. On the more accessible sections men and tractors and bulldozers continued the job of getting a fire-break cutted out around the fire. The U.S. Forest Service said the fire has destroyed 25 million dollars worth of watershed. The fire is 30 miles northeast of Los Angeles.
