Air Force Awards Contract For Satellite Study Project

WASHINGTON (UP) - The Air Force has awarded a contract for "studies" of a reconnaissance satellite which may be built and launched in the early 1960s.

The contract for the project, dubbed "Pied Piper," went to Lockheed Aircraft Corp., Burbank, Calif.

Government sources described the project as definitely being in the "study stage" at this time. They indicated Lockheed would gain considerable information for the project from studies of its three-stage X17 rocket.

This is an Air Force project designed to help solve the problem of bringing ballistic missiles back through the atmosphere at tremendous speeds without having them burn up like meteors as a result of friction with air particles.

Government sources took exception to a reported launching schedule for the reconnaissance satellite which was published Sunday by "Data," a private publication dealing with government research and development information.

The Lockheed X17 rocket, which was expected to be of value in the "Pied Piper" project, is carried aloft by its first rocket stage. The other two rockets then return to earth, developing the tremendous speeds necessary for study of the re-entry problem.

Government sources said that information derived from the forthcoming North American Aviation X15 rocket plane also might prove useful in development of the reconnaissance satellite.

The X15, expected to fly in 1958, may exceed 4,000 miles an hour at altitudes above 400,000 feet.

Sweden Eyes Object Report

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) - A report by a Swedish officer of a shining object traveling on a spiral course toward the moon was under examination at Sweden's defense headquarters Monday.

"The best guess so far seems to be it might have something to do with Russian satellite or missile experiments," a staff spokesman said.

He said the observation was made Sunday by a Swedish army captain at Kortedala near Göteborg, on the Swedish west coast.

"The captain reported he watched the object through his field glass for 20 minutes," the spokesman said.

"We are taking this report seriously since it came from a competent observer. The captain described the object as a flattened sphere circling moonwards. Its sides were somewhat elongated and there was a flickering glow as from burning exhaust gases from one side."
