### Pettit Gains NBA Scoring

Bob Pettit has regained the National Basketball Association scoring lead, but four other players are within easy striking distance of the St. Louis ace.

Pettit dunked in 31 points in two games last week for a season total of 327. George Yardley of Detroit and Dolph Schayes of Syracuse are tied for second with 318 points, while Philadelphia's Neil Johnston has 312 and Bill Sharman of Boston has 310.

Yardley, who has played in one less game than the other leaders, maintains the best per-game average of 26.5, followed by Pettit's 25.2.

Schayes, besides gunning for this year's scoring championship, is also set on replacing Ed Macauley of St. Louis as the NBA's highest lifetime scorer in regular season competition. The former NYU great, in his ninth year of pro ball, has compiled 10,291 points, 39 less than Macauley.

In the current race for other offensive honors, Johnston leads in field goal accuracy (.467). Sharman is on top in free throw shooting (.916). Bill Russell of Boston is the leading rebounder (.333) and Maurice Stokes of Cincinnati is ahead in assists (.77).

### PCL Angels Eye Spokane Playing Site

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP)—The Los Angeles Angels of the Pacific Coast League may be playing in Spokane next season if the local governmental "angels" can be found with \$200,000 or more to fix up the baseball park here.

Mayor Willard Tait and a six-man committee started looking today for some way to get the money after Dick Walsh, president of the Los Angeles club, indicated the Angels were ready to move here.

The committee agreed at the outset the cash would have to come from the city, the county or a combination of both, that "private enterprise" couldn't do it. "No matter what, don't let this opportunity pass," said Clyde Perkins of the Portland Beavers, president of the PCL's Realignement Committee. "It may not

come again." Walsh said the Brooklyn Dodgers organization, which took over the Los Angeles PCL franchise earlier this year, would have to know what Spokane can do within 10 days. The Dodgers have already moved into Los Angeles for the 1958 National League season.

Spokane, with a Brooklyn tieup, drew a record Class B league attendance of 237,000 in 1947, but the ball park burned down the next year and reconstruction was slow and costly on a community-owned basis. The Spokane Indians in the Class B Northwest League folded up last year and the city had no professional baseball in 1957.

Henry George, a well-to-do contractor and last president of the Indians, said he would join with other local contractors and bor-

row the \$200,000 to get the local park, Ferris Field, in shape by May 1 if he has a firm contract with the city.

He said he could raise the seating capacity of Ferris Field from its present 3,000 to 10,000 for \$200,000 and the city wouldn't have to pay for a year or two.

Commissioner of Public Affairs Kenneth Lawson said he is highly in favor of PCL baseball here, but that George was being "very generous with other people's money" and that there were many legal problems to work out.

### Today's Sports Parade

NEW YORK (UP)—The will and determination to win means much to Capt. Slade Cutter, and it explains why Navy's athletic director is fretting today over "an atmosphere of complacency" among the brigade of Midshipmen as they head for the annual grid encounter with Army.

Cutter always has been a man big in the guts and perseverance department. He had to be, starting out as the national interscholastic flute solo champion.

But despite that beginning, square-jawed Slade became one of the finest athletes at Annapolis, and one of the Navy's most decorated submarine officers in World War II in which his submarines accounted for 19 enemy ships.

"The boys seem to be taking this one for granted," complained the man whose 20-yard field goal beat Army in 1934 and who went undefeated in 22 fights as a collegiate heavyweight.

"It's the brigade, not the team or the coaching staff," he added. "But at Annapolis the team is surrounded by the student body throughout most of the day and it's a tremendous influence. If they communicate this feeling to the team, we're sunk."

As an example of the necessity to have that fervent desire for victory he recalls the 1942 game in which Army was the heavy favorite.

"We had no business on the same field with them, but we won it, 14 to 0," he illustrated. "We just wanted it worse than they did."

But there's one — pointing up the need for that winning desire—which stands foremost in his mind.

That game was in 1950 when Cutter was stationed in California and again Navy was the underdog against Army.

"We were supposed to have some folks in to listen to the game on the radio," he said. "But then I heard the news that the fifth regiment of the First Marine Division had been surrounded at the Chosen Reservoir in Korea. "My kid sister's husband was in that outfit," Cutter remembered sadly.

Cutter was shaken by the news. He couldn't go home and face his guests. So he simply sat in his car and then, despite his mental depression, finally tuned in the Army-Navy game alone.

"Navy wasn't supposed to win that one, either," he recalls. "But those kids fought their hearts out and they won it, 14 to 2."

It gave the worried Cutter what he calls tersely "a helluva mental lift."

"I figure that if those kids could fight their way out of that one," he grinned, "maybe the Marines could too. And, what do you think? Damned if they didn't."

Which explains why Capt. Slade Cutter wants a fighting Navy team down there on the bright green turf at Municipal Stadium on Saturday. And why, as Navy's athletic director, he's trying to see that's what they'll have.
