since. Coming back, he won another bout and then was cut up so badly by Ralph Dupas that he was out four months. Frankie re

turned to win three and then had a brown operation which put him on the sidelines six months. Coming back rusty, he was flattened and chopped up so badly he was inactive another four months.

HE'S OUT AGAIN

The last time he went so far as to have the sharp bones in his brow pared in a painful operation. He waited another four months for that to heal, won two

comeback bouts—and Monday night won his third but suffered gashes which required 14 stitches and will sideline him another three or four months.

At 25, he may disgustedly toss in the sponge. Because Frankie knows that the long layoffs constantly keep him from getting to the top and the "big bleeders" never make it.

In the old days, the "bleeders" faced the threat of blindness by fighting again too soon. In this era, a cut calls for an automatic 30-day suspension and a commission examination before being reinstated.

So Ryff can fight again eventually. But as long as the "eyes" have it, he's on a treadmill back to nowhere.

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Duke '5' Wins 6th In A Row

By rights, Duke's Blue Devils should be dragging their feet about now. Instead, they're sprinting through a suicide schedule in a run for the top in the tough Atlantic Coast Conference basketball race.

The 73-57 victory over Clemson last night was the sixth straight for the Blue Devils, now tied for second in the ACC, and their third in four nights!

Trouble is, Duke has two more to go in its rough rumble through five games in 11 days' time. And the two left are no pushovers—defending champ North Carolina Saturday and first place North Carolina State next Tuesday, both on the road.

All the scrambling isn't for a title, just for position in the pairings for next month's tournament that will decide the champion and NCAA tournament entry. The first and fourth place finishers in regular season play are paired in one bracket, the second and third place clubs in the other.

NC State slipped out of a tie with Duke North Carolina by getting past Virginia 61-58 last night while Duke joined the Tar Heels in second place. NC State is 7-2, North Carolina and Duke 6-2.

First half shooting decided the game against Clemson at Charlotte, N.C., with the Blue Devils hitting 53 per cent from the field while Clemson managed only 154. NC State, 13-3 for the season and ranked No. 9 nationally, needed a hot shot by Lou Puccio and a pair by Whitey Bell in the final minute to get past Virginia.

In the Southwest Conference, where a high-scoring game is still an oddity, Rice hit 60 per cent from the field and joined Texas Tech and Southern Methodist in a tie for second with a 102-68 victory over Texas. And Texas A&M set a school scoring record with a 92-74 decision over Houston in a non-conference game.

Virginia Tech hit 100 points for the fourth time in history, whipping Furman 102-76 in a Southern Conference game. Tech's three fabulous freshmen averaged 80 points among them—Bob Ayersman getting 33, Earl Gilbert 28 and Chris Smith 19.

Piston Eyes NBA Record

With a little luck, George Yardley of the Detroit Pistons, the National Basketball Association's top scorer, can become the first player to score 2,000 points in a single season.

The balding, former Stanford University star pumped in 52 points Tuesday night to run his season total to 1,463 in 54 games. If he betters his game average of 27.2 by a little more than two points in the remaining 18 games Yardley can reach the 2,000 point circle.

Even if Yardley misses that figure, he is almost certain to top the previous season record of 1,849 set by Bob Pettit of the St. Louis Hawks in 1955-56.

Despite Yardley's peak performance the Pistons had all they could do to stave off the Syracuse Nationals, whom they finally downed, 118-113.

In other games, the New York Knickerbockers snapped a four-game losing streak in defeating the St. Louis Hawks, 120-116, in the nightcap of a Madison Square doubleheader before 15,138 fans after the Boston Celtics routed the Cincinnati Royals, 107-87. The Philadelphia Warriors survived a Minneapolis rally to gain a 107-103 win over the Lakers in the preview to the Pistons - Nationals game at the Detroit Olympia.

FIGHT GETS TV OKAY

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—Next month's 12-round fight between heavyweights Eddie Machen and Zora Folley will be nationally televised by ABC, it was announced by matchmaker Bennie Ford.

Ford also said that the fight, scheduled for March 19, would be blacked out within a 300-mile radius of San Francisco.
