



Combining Dairying and Farming is formula for Success on Ed Born's Grade "A" Dairy Operation!

Dairy is on Spring Lake Road

With the aid of his 3 sons, Ed Born farms a total of 350 acres — a 150 acre Grade "A" Dairy on Spring Lake Road and another 200 acres at the "home place" near Lost River Dam.

For the past six years Ed's "milker," Calvin McNary, has handled most of the duties at the dairy, caring for the herd of 45 tested Holsteins (pictured above) and the thousands of dollars of equipment needed to produce fresh, rich Grade "A" Milk.

Ed was born in Switzerland, moved with his family to Portland in 1915, and came to the Klamath Basin in the fall of '25. Below, he demonstrates that a farmer's work is never done, with the winter months being devoted to repairs and preparation for spring and summer.
