THE SUCCESS of the Taft Code soon was noised about. Other schools called on Taft students and faculty to help them write codes for their pupils. Demands for help were so numerous that the faculty turned the matter over to the Taft PTA, which organized a Codes of Conduct Congress, held in 1955.

Letters requesting information and aid began pouring in after the congress. More than 15,000 copies of the Taft Code were distributed to schools and other organizations.

From a high school out in Colorado Springs, Colo., which was using the Chicago code as a pattern for creating its own, a teacher wrote: "The impact is unbelievable. We are only in the talking stage now with our experiment, but the enthusiasm of the students exceeds anything I have ever seen."

A student at New Trier High School, in the Chicago area, declared: "It gives teen-agers like myself an opportunity to lay down our rules of conduct. It makes us responsible for the success of the experiment."

Irondequoit High School is spearheading codes of conduct in Rochester, N. Y. Other codes are being adopted in Galena Park, Tex.; Rapid City, S. D.; Lineville, Ala.; and many other cities.

The National Association for the Prevention of Juvenile Delinquency, Inc., is working with the idea of codes to combat delinquency. Chiefs of police and judges in many cities have asked for information and aid on formulating codes of conduct.

The Division of Adult Education and the Extension Service at the University of Washington in Seattle are working with the Codes of Conduct Congress in placing codes in high schools throughout the State of Washington. A similar development is under way in the General Extension Division of the University of Florida in Gainesville.

The Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association sent the code of conduct to 2,500 coaches, principals, and sports officials in Tennessee, as well as to county superintendents and the executive secretary of each state high-school athletic association.

CODES OF CONDUCT are developing along three lines. Some are rules covering the school area, much like the Taft Code of Conduct. Another approach is the Code of Ethics, which states objectives but does not state particular DOs and DON'Ts. The third is the development of codes to fit a particular school situation, with committees to work out the details, publicize the ideas, and see that the code

operates effectively in that area.

The chairman of the Code of Conduct Congress, David O. Taylor, points out that there may be several codes operating in a school at one time. In fact, he says, many schools are beginning to find this is the most effective plan.

"A code can set the ideals for a school," Taylor says. "The provisions of a code can be the basis for the development of a 'school tradition.' It may become so ingrained in the school deportment and thinking that later students come to say, 'This is how we do it here.' They lose sight of how the idea came into being."

The development can be most effective when the students urgently feel the need for such a code. This was amply illustrated in one school where a lunchroom code was put into effect. It worked so well that pupils proceeded to form a general code of conduct.

Another school tried a code governing dress and campus care. Soon the students added a code of sportsmanship. Trouble that had previously developed in inter-school sports failed to materialize after acceptance of the rules.

In 1957, more than 600 high-school students from all over America descended upon the University of Chicago for the fifth Codes of Conduct Congress. They discussed such topics as Discipline Through the Use of Codes of Conduct, How to Make a Code of Conduct, and How to Keep the Code Alive.

A tribute to the success of codes of conduct came in a congratulatory telegram to the second Code of Conduct Congress. It read:

"I congratulate the young people of Chicago and Cook County who seek through this program to make themselves better citizens of their community and America. It is reassuring to know of this movement in which young people have accepted the responsibility to face and solve problems confronting them which arise from life in a major metropolitan area."

The signature on the telegram read: "DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER."

Perhaps the best comment on a code to be voiced by any high-school student came from Robert Scholz of Luther High School in Chicago.

"The Ten Commandments is the best-known of codes and covers everything in life a person can do," Scholz said.

"Like the Ten Commandments, our codes today must have God at their base or they are meaningless."
