Police Seek Cop Killer

He is George Edward Cole, 31, who is wanted in California for the murder of a police officer and for violation of the unlawful flight to avoid prosecution statute.

Cole is six feet one and weighs 160 to 175 pounds. He has a medium build, brown hair, brown eyes and a medium complexion.

He may work as a bus or truck driver or a typist and has a pit scar on the outside corner of his right eye, small cut scar on the inside of his left wrist, is tattooed with a small heart and names "Mom" and "Dad" and the letters "GP" or "SP" on left forearm. He also has a tattoo of an eight-point star on the back of his left hand.

Cole has previously been convicted of grand larceny and robbery and has been quoted as saying that he will shoot any police officer attempting to apprehend him.

He is armed and considered dangerous.
