LAKEVIEW — The success of a beef cookery demonstration held in Lakeview Tuesday evening, February 4, in the high school home economics room and sponsored by the Lake County Cowbelles, is expected to spark a series of similar demonstrations throughout the state in a beef promotion drive, according to Mrs. Dave Campbell of Bly, president of the state Cowbelles group who was a guest.

Seventy one women answered the invitation of the Lake County organization, headed by Mrs. Erwin Abramson. Conspicuous among them were a group of young 4-H Club cooking members, as well as young daughters of the Cowbelles and guests.

The demonstrations were made by Mrs. Beverly Lyons, Medford, home economist for the California Oregon Power Company, who had actual results available of a variety of beef cuts cooked during the two-hour period. The recipes were also distributed to the guests, and a discussion period was conducted by Mrs. Lyons. The meat was donated by local markets.

The Cowbelles cook book and the beef candy, promotions of the group, were made available during the evening.

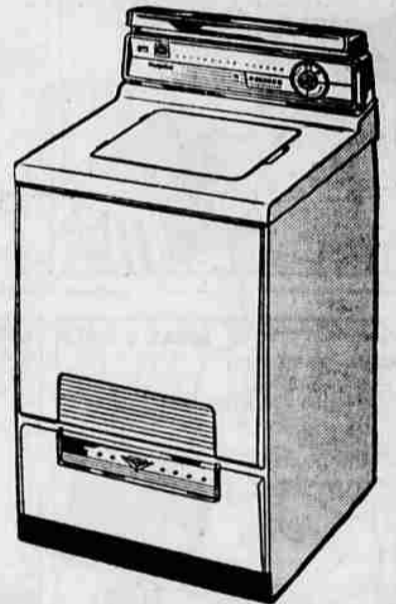

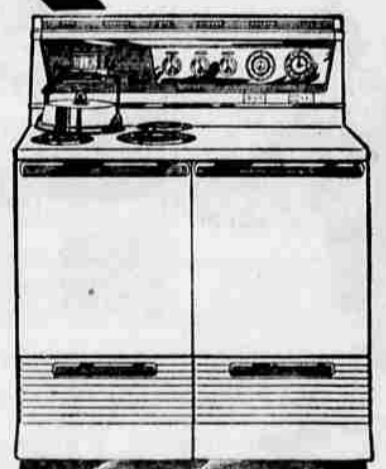
