## Mice Control Sessions Held

**LANGELL VALLEY**—Meetings on mouse control were held in Bonanza and Langell Valley on February 7 with J. D. Vertrees, assistant county agent, in charge of both meetings. About 30 farmers attended the afternoon meeting in Bonanza and about 50 at the evening meeting held in Langell Valley.

The program of poisoning will start in the valley communities the last week of February before the grass starts to grow.

Truckloads of poison will be brought to the different communities. Some of the poison will cost two cents a pound and others six cents a pound.

The roads will be poisoned by Klamath County, and the irrigation districts will poison the ditch banks.

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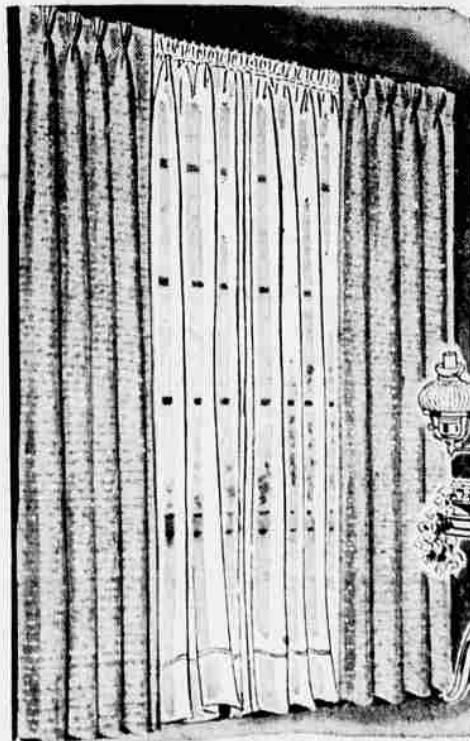
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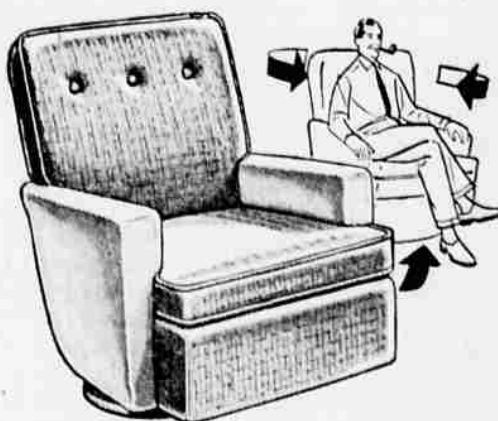
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
