south or southwest 10-20 m.p.h. south of Monterey; rain likely Sunday with snow in mountains. Mt. Shasta-Siskiyou area: Intermittent rains low levels and snow with high levels through Saturday with snow level from 3,500 to 4,000 feet; heavy amounts of precipitation likely Saturday; strong southerly winds at times; little change in temperature; snow or rain likely Sunday.

Pastor Wins Promotion

The Rev. Burton Alvis, pastor of Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church, South Sixth Street, has been named to the staff of the Synod of Oregon to serve as field director. The appointment, a promotion, was announced this week by the Board of Christian Education of the Presbyterian Church with headquarters in Philadelphia. He will assume his new duties on April 16.

The family will remain in Klamath Falls until the end of the spring school term, then will move to Portland where the synod headquarters are located.

Rev. Alvis is a native of Washington, raised in Spokane and Yakima. He earned his college degree at Whitworth College and received his seminary training at the San Francisco Theological Seminary. He served churches in Northern California and in Portland before coming to Klamath Falls.

He has been active in community affairs as a member of the Klamath Falls Kiwanis Club and the Klamath Basin Council of Churches. He has also held positions in his denomination as chairman of the Christian Education Missions Committee of the Presbytery of Southwest Oregon, chairman of the Christian Education Committee of the Synod of Oregon and as a member of the synod's executive council.

Judge Named For Contest

Mrs. Marcella Bigler, chief stewardess for West Coast Airlines, will be one of the judges in the Junior Miss Oregon of 1958 Contest which will be held in the Mills School auditorium, February 18.

Dean DeWitt, chairman of the sponsoring organization, the Klamath County Junior Chamber of Commerce, local advertising man, will emcee the show which will start at 7:30 p.m. There are nine girls competing for Junior Miss Oregon and in addition to the songs, piano playing and dramatic readings by the girls, top local entertainment has been obtained, he said.

Tickets are on sale at the chamber of commerce, Leo's Camera Shop and the House of Shoes in the Town and Country Shopping Center. Price is 75 cents for adults and 50 cents for students and children.

DeWitt said that the contest is a windfall for Klamath County because a county girl will be Junior Miss Oregon and will attend the Azalea Festival in Mobile, Alabama, to compete for \$10,000 in college scholarships.

Judging at the Mobile festival will be held February 27 through March 1, with first prize a \$5,000 scholarship. Second prize is a \$2,000 scholarship and three \$1,000 scholarships for the next three places.
