At Lake Placid, N. Y., where sled-dog clubs test their pets at annual time trials, these handsome, thick-coated animals may run as much as 25 miles a day over snow-packed trails, dragging huge Eskimo sleds behind them. Bleeding paws and exhaustion often overcome some dogs, but their work has a distinct advantage over that of other breeds.
