

\$136,300 Road Project Slated

YREKA — A \$136,300 road construction project will be started sometime this spring, according to Road Commissioner Joe Allen.

The project entails the construction of three bridges, which will provide additional links in the Weaverville to Klamath River highway, and bids for the construction of these bridges will be opened by the Division of Highways on March 12. Bridges under consideration will be at the south fork of the Scott River and at Wildcat and Sugar creeks on the west side road between Callahan and Cedar Gulch.

The structure over the south fork of the Scott River will have a span of 180 feet; while the bridges at Wildcat and Sugar creeks will be 64 feet long.

According to the road commissioner, the \$136,300 construction job will be let under a single contract.
