### Young Army Officer Holds Key To Oil Rich Sumatra

**JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP)** — A United States. But Barlian, whose name translates into "Diamond," quietly devout young Moslem army officer named Barlian holds the key to the vast oil resources on the rebellious island of Sumatra.

He has warned both sides in the so-far bloodless dispute he will not allow Southern Sumatra, site of multimillion-dollar American and European oil installations, to become a battleground.

The new anti-Communist rebel government in Central Sumatra has ordered the companies to cease paying royalties to the central Indonesian government and to stop all deliveries to the oil-dependent island of Java. If Barlian—who commands the southern part of the island, the rebel gesture will be an empty one.

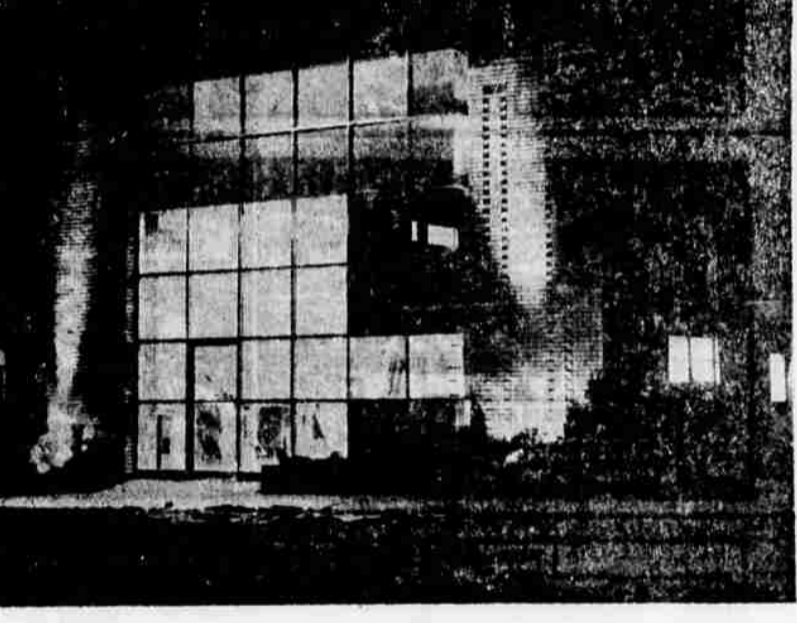
