The offer was made for the private school by Dr. John J. Brooks, its founding director. It is believed that the girl will move to New York next week.

Minnie Jean was expelled from Little Rock Monday. School officials declined to give reasons. She had been involved in racial incidents.

### GOP Makes Election Win

MINNEAPOLIS — A young dairy farmer, almost as little known in Minnesota as outside it, barely retained Minnesota's 1st Congressional District seat for the Republican party yesterday against a startlingly strong Democratic challenge.

Albert Quie, 34 and a freshman state senator, won the seat left vacant last month by the death of Rep. August Andresen. His Democratic opponent said he was considering a recount, which could upset the result.

Quie defeated Eugene Foley, 29-year-old attorney, by just 655 votes, or 50.37 per cent of the vote cast, according to complete unofficial returns.

The vote from all 411 precincts was Quie 44,310, Foley 43,655.

The district, 12 dairy farming counties in the southeastern corner of the state, has been solidly Republican since 1893. Andresen won reelection in recent years with margins never lower than 61 per cent, and usually higher.

The near-upset was certain to be hailed by Democrats as both a moral victory and a rebuke to the policies of Secretary of Agriculture Benson.

Foley, even more of an unknown than Quie, campaigned hardest on a "Benson must go" theme. Quie, himself cool to Benson, opposed the scheduled cut in dairy support prices and advanced his own farm program which, he said "takes a completely different approach" from Benson's.
