### Athey Files For Council

YREKA — Edward M. Athey, Yreka home builder, announced his candidacy for a seat on the Yreka City Council last week. His principal objective is developing the old Yreka Elementary School into a city hall and recreation center.

Athey, 36, was born in San Jacinto, later moving with his family to Tucson, Arizona, where his father operated a produce farm. Later, the family moved to St. Augustine, Florida, where Athey completed high school. The remainder of his education was two years at the University of Florida. In March, 1942, he joined the Army as a private, and attained the rank of a paratrooper lieutenant of infantry, taking part in action in the European theater.

He started his business of building contractor in Yreka in 1949, and was captain of the local National Guard unit in 1948-49.

He holds a membership with the Knights of Pythias, Yreka and the Kiwanis Club. He is an active member with St. Marks Episcopal Church, and at present is serving as vestryman with the church.

Athey is married and he and his wife have a daughter, Julie, 11 years old.

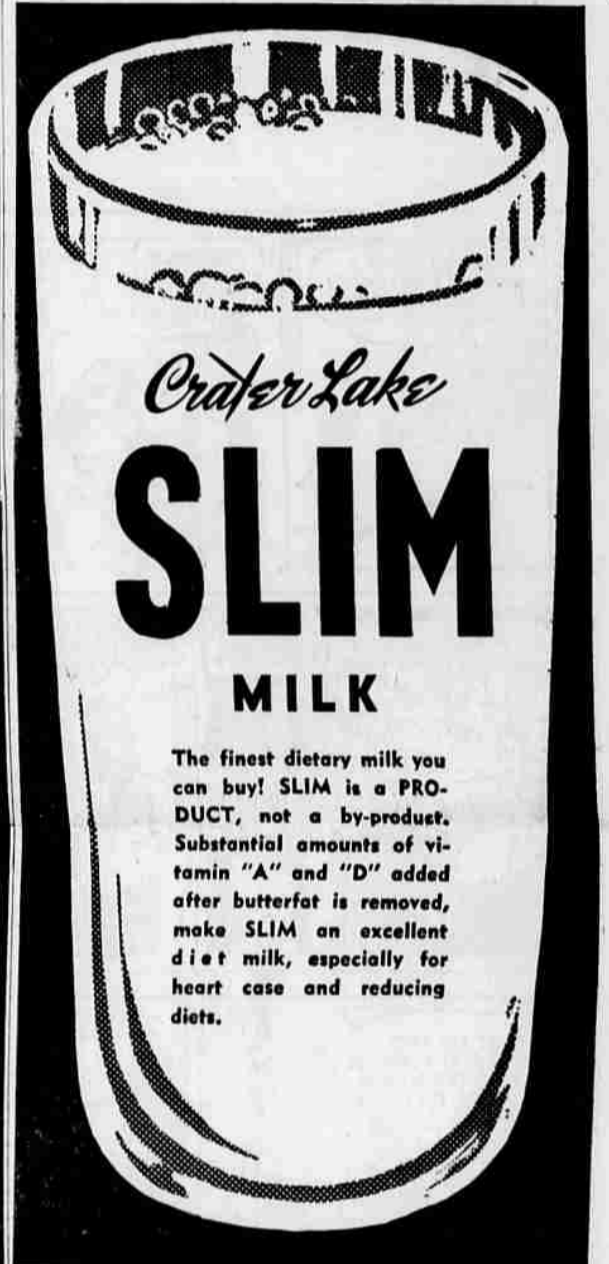
