

# Icy Weather Still Grips New York

Sections of New York State still felt the effects of winter's worst storm and cold today but mostly rain and warmer weather was the outlook in the eastern two-thirds of the nation.

Fairly mild weather, with some precipitation, prevailed in most of the Far Western States.

Gov. Averell Harriman declared a state of emergency in New York State. Blizzards and severe cold have hampered upstate areas. He appealed for federal equipment to help snowbound families and clear the huge snow drifts from roads.

Uncounted families in rural areas remained isolated as hundreds of miles of secondary roads were blocked by the huge drifts. The blizzard was blamed for 44 deaths in New York State.

New York State and other parts of the snow-covered Northeast also were warned by the Weather Bureau in Washington that there is a potential flood situation, but no immediate threat. A sudden thaw, with widespread rains, could raise rivers and streams to dangerous levels.

Snow flurries fell in upper New York State but clear and cold weather prevailed from the Appalachians to the eastern seaboard except in Florida. New York City had its first reading of above freezing yesterday since Feb. 8 when the mercury reached 35 degrees.

It was freezing again in Southern states, with temperatures in the 20s in parts of Alabama, Georgia, the Carolinas, Kentucky and Tennessee. Normal readings are in the mid 30s and low 40s.

Cold also continued in sections of New England and the lower Great Lakes region, while temperatures moderated in most sections from the Appalachians westward.

Readings ranged from 10 to nearly 40 degrees higher than yesterday morning from northern Arkansas and northern Oklahoma northward to Minnesota and the Lake Superior region.

Below freezing marks west of the Mississippi River were confined to northeastern Montana, parts of the Dakotas, Iowa and Minnesota. Temperatures climbed to the 50s yesterday in the Western Plains from the Texas Panhandle to North Dakota.

Heaviest precipitation was in extreme southern Texas, although a shower belt extended from Arizona eastward through Texas. Rainfall measured nearly three inches at Corpus Christi.

Light freezing drizzle slicked highways in the Upper Mississippi Valley and there were showers in scattered areas in the Pacific Northwest.

During the years they have been in Africa, a school has been built. About 168 boys and girls have been taught by the missionaries. Open Bible Standard Churches completed the school and clinic seven years ago, today one of the largest mission stations in Liberia. The Crossmans will have colored slides of the great work that is being accomplished by missionaries in that part of the world. The Rev. Harry M. Strachan, pastor, invites the public to attend this special one night service. The Rev. Strachan will minister in the morning worship hour at 11 a.m. His topic will be "The End Of A Rebel."

# New Church Plans Studied

CHILOQUIN—The firm of Morrison and Howard, architects, have submitted first sketches of an addition to the Chiliquin Methodist Church and are now preparing blueprints for the building. It has been announced by the church building committee, headed until recently by John Heilbroner and now by Joseph Jackson.

The plans are in two sections, one for a 24 foot by 43 foot one-story section to be built immediately to the rear of the church, and the second an additional space to be constructed in future years. The first section will be a social hall which can be subdivided into classroom space. It will have a ground level entrance, a narthex with a fireplace in the social hall.

Plans also include changing the chancel from the east to the west end of the church, removing the steep entrance stairway at the west side of the building and arranging a protected entrance. Later plans call for a ground level kitchen and extra classrooms, and complete remodeling of the basement of the church.
