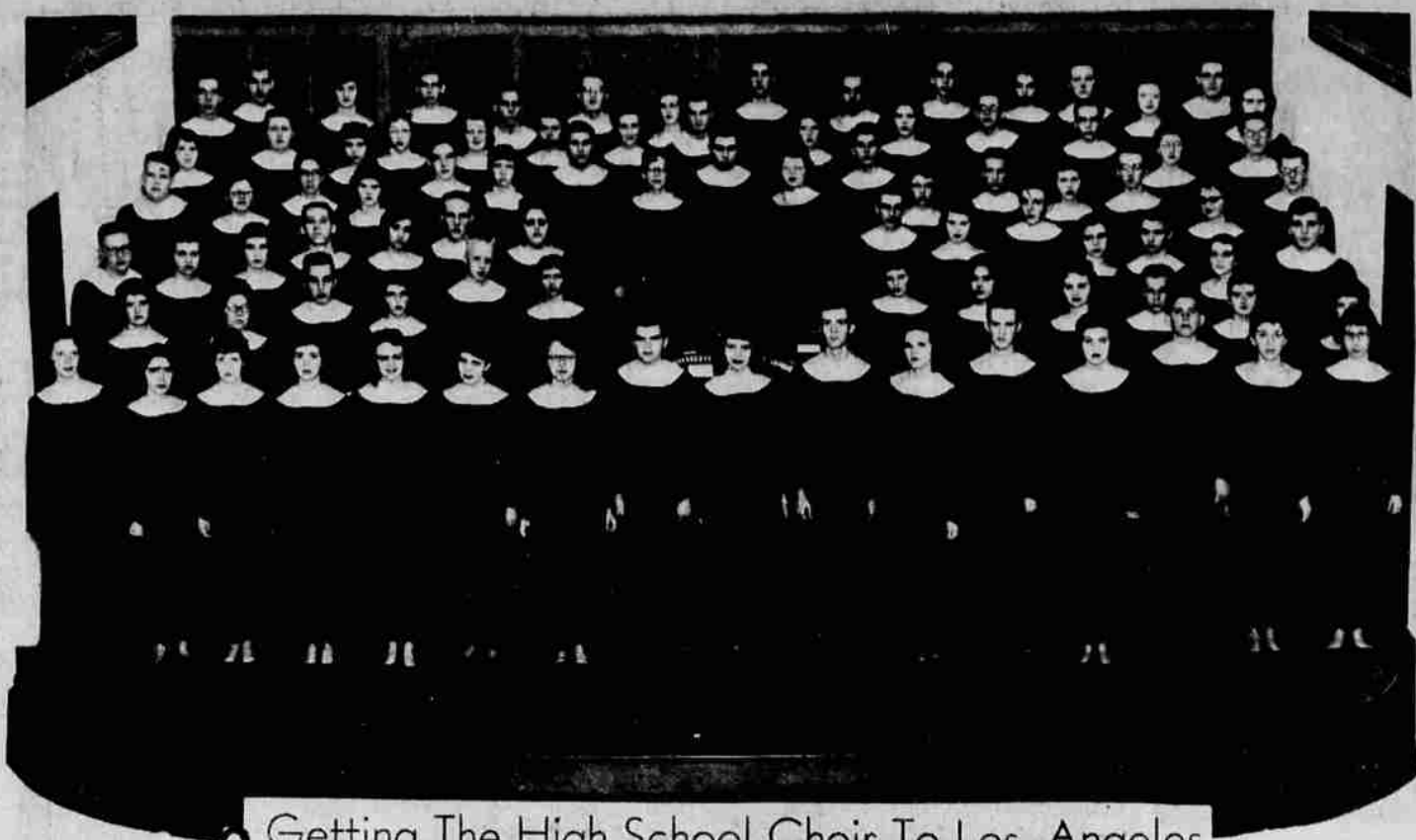




Getting The High School Choir To Los Angeles For Appearance In The Philharmonic Auditorium Is Worthwhile "Citizen Project"

A large helping hand was extended by Klamath Theaters Incorporated when they offered the Pelican Theater and a movie for a gala one-night stage and screen show starting at 8 p.m., on Wednesday, March 12. Featured attractions on the stage will be the Klamath High School Choir and the KUHS Concert Band.

Andy Loney, director of music education in Klamath Falls schools for 16 years, his assistant director Steve Stone and choir members are now putting in a lot of practice hours on two programs.

The first, at the Pelican Theater on March 12, will be given to help make the March 22 convention appearance possible.
