The hall and dining room were

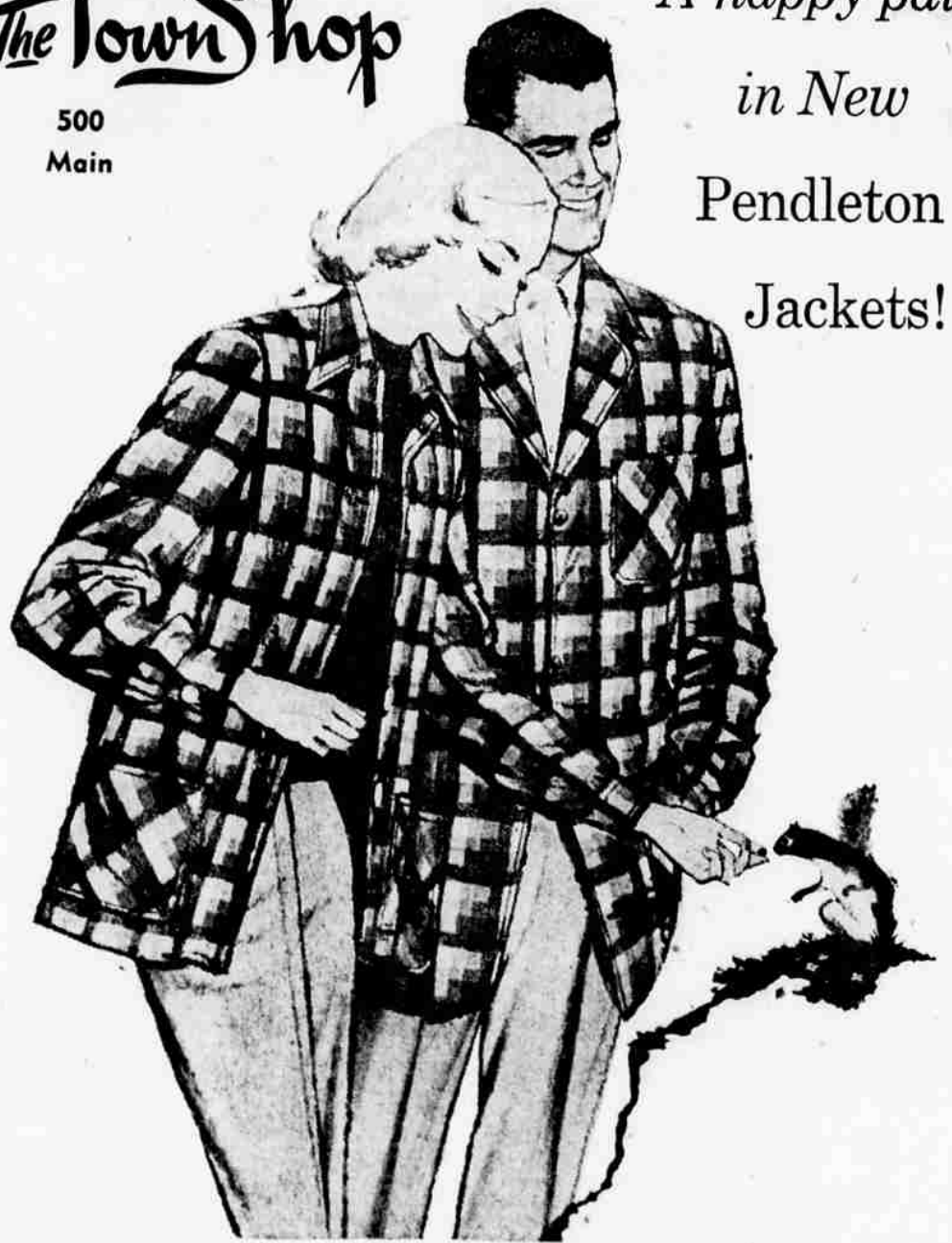
