



MILK RING TEST SAMPLES to detect brucellosis-infected herds are collected at a central dairy. The milk is dipped from each can. Samples from five to 12 cows are pooled in one vial, recorded as to source, and sent to a field or central laboratory for analysis.



TRUCKS AND OTHER VEHICLES in which brucellosis reactors are transported must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected. Here a truck which has delivered a load of reactors to a public stockyard is being disinfected under the supervision of a federal inspector.

To help strengthen the brucellosis eradication program stricter federal control of interstate movement of cattle has been effective since January 1, 1957. Only steers, spayed heifers and calves under eight months of age are exempt.

Homes Require Area For Loafing

Every home should have an area for loafing, believes Seattle architect Hawley A. Dudley Jr.

He used a sloping ceiling in designing his own "home of cedar" overlooking Washington's fabled Puget Sound to create a loafing area.

The living room faces a panorama of water, boats and timbered beauty, so Architect Dudley used a glass wall of windows ten feet high to frame this view. The ceiling slopes up to fifteen feet in this area, but drops to seven and a half feet at the back. In this snug, intimate area away from the window wall, he has built his loafing area. Bookcases made of western red cedar match the walls and ceiling of the same material to create a warm and friendly room.

It is surprising what an atmosphere of intimacy can be created in that part of the room by a low, sloping ceiling, especially if the rest of the room opens away into a lovely view.

County Agent Reports Farm News Briefed From The County Agent Radio Programs

The movement of cattle between states is still under control of the federal government and anyone who wishes to move cattle across state lines must meet one of several requirements of the federal order which regulates the interstate movement of cattle. Cattle may move interstate provided they meet one of the following requirements:

1. Pass a clean test for brucellosis within 30 days of the movement of the cattle.
 2. Be from a modified, certified brucellosis free herd. This will include cattle that have been tested and found to have no reactors.
 3. Vaccinated cattle from negative herds and under 30 months of age.
 4. All steers or spayed heifers.
 5. Cattle of beef breeds moving interstate for feeding and grazing and being held under quarantine. Such cattle must move under a permit secured from the state veterinarian in the state of origin and approved by the state veterinarian in the state of destination.
- Cattle owners wishing to move under a quarantine permit must first fill out an application for such a permit. The county agent's office now has a supply of these forms and will assist anyone in the completion of this application. After filling out the application form the request is sent to the state veterinarian in the state of origin. This would mean that cattlemen with cattle now in Oregon to be moved to California, Nevada or

Idaho, will send an application to Dr. K. J. Peterson, state veterinarian at Salem. Dr. Peterson will approve the permit and forward it to the state veterinarian in the state of destination who will approve the application and forward it to the cattle owner.

The approved permit must accompany the cattle along with the brand inspection to the point of destination and be available at all times.

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
