BERLIN (UP)—Soviet headquarters in East Germany said today the announced withdrawal of 41,000 Russian troops will begin Thursday. The announcement published by the Soviet Zone news agency ADN, said the first evacuation would take place at Pterstenwalde.

The jury deliberated for nearly six hours before returning the verdict to Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg. Attorney Arthur Beddoe represented the defendant. Prosecuting for the state was Deputy District Attorney Freeman C. Murray. Jury selection for the case began Monday morning.
