School Gas Figure Eyed

Members of the city school boards have elected to accept an offer by the Shell Oil Company whereby the city school districts can purchase their gasoline at the 29.87 cents per gallon bid to the county court for county gasoline needs.

The former practice has been for the city schools to buy their gasoline on the bid figure accepted by the county school operation. This year the winning county school figure was 21.19 cents per gallon.

Before electing to buy the 1958-59 gasoline on the county bid figure, city board members were assured by county school officials that the city's action would in no way impair the figure offered the county schools, and that the companies submitting bids to the county school system had not done so on the assumption that the bid would also apply to city school gallonage.

DUNSMUIR — About 3,500 yards of muck fell off the embankment just north of the Dunsmuir High School early Tuesday morning as the most serious aftermath of Monday's storm.

The slide took about one-tenth of the high school's newly developed \$10,000 athletic field along with about 20 feet of driveway and \$1,500 in steel fencing and retaining wall.

The exact amount of damage was difficult to determine. Delwin Poe, high school superintendent, said he was going to have advice on the matter from the State Division of Highways. The site of the mud slide is also the site of the Willow Street underpass which is currently included in freeway plans through Dunsmuir.

Other storm damage in the community included about 100 feet of Gillis Street and 50 feet of River Avenue washed out. South First Street, which was partially under water on Monday, was damaged but passable.
