Rebels Report New Bombing

SINGAPORE (AP) — Indonesian rebel sources reported today that Menado, the capital of the rebel-held province of North Celebes, was bombed yesterday by two planes of the central government's air force.

The correspondent of the Manila Times said casualties were light, indicating that possibly the crowd at the rally had not been attacked.

Reporting on its raids on the rebel stronghold in Central Sumatra, Indonesian air force spokesmen in Jakarta said a series of attacks last week cut off the rebel government there from the outside world by knocking out ferry operations.

On the political front, former Vice President Mohammed Hatta met with Sukarno in Jakarta for the second time since the rebels in the Outer Islands set up their government on Sumatra.

Hatta generally endorses the rebel demands for removal of Communists from the central government and more autonomy for the Outer Islands but so far has refused to throw in with the rebels formally.
