Teacher Sets Ouster Fight

LAKELAND, Ga. (AP)—A veteran south Georgia schoolteacher, who said she was pressured into resigning after she permitted a white pupil to ride a Negro school bus plans to take her case to the State Board of Education.

The Lanier County Board of Education declined to reinstate Mrs. A. B. Baskin. It ruled the white-haired fourth grade teacher's resignation had been unanimously accepted and that there is no vacancy in the county school system for her.

In December, Mrs. Baskin flagged down a school bus after she had a flat tire while driving three of her fourth grade pupils home.

It turned out to be a bus for Negroes. Mrs. Baskin said she offered 9-year-old Pat Taylor his choice of riding the bus or waiting for the tire to be fixed. He rode the bus.

Mrs. Baskin, who has spent 21 of her 22 teaching years in Lanier County, testified that three school officials — Supt. J. W. Threante, Board Chairman Wallace Tipton and Vice Chairman John C. Crum — later visited her at home and indicated that she either had to resign or be fired. She said reference was made to "mob violence and a Little Rock" in Lakeland.

The officials denied this.

Mrs. Baskin, in announcing her appeal, said "My self respect requires that I place my case before the State Board of Education, seeking redress there. . . . Supt. Threante said that my teaching is satisfactory in every way, that I am not an integrationist. . . .

"What are the charges against me? How can he believe I voluntarily resigned when he and the other two men came to my home? They asked me to resign then or be fired. . . ."

Reds Seek New Meeting

SEOUL, Korea (AP)—The Communists called another meeting Thursday of the Military Armistice Commission "for the purpose of returning those who wish to return" from the hijacked South Korean airliner.

The Communists request for the new meeting contained no mention of their previous requirement of direct negotiations between North Korea and governments of the 34 persons on the plane that flew into North Korea Feb. 16.

Representatives of the U.N. Command rejected the previous Red demand yesterday at a meeting at which North Korea had indicated earlier it would hand over the two Americans, two West Germans and some of the 30 South Koreans on the plane.

The U.N. Command said representatives of the U.S., West German and South Korean governments would attend Thursday's meeting at Panmunjom to receive their own nationals.

The Americans are Willis P. Hobbs, Vallejo, Calif., and Air Force Lt. Col. Howard W. McClellan, Buchanan, Mich., pilot and copilot of the Pusan-to-Seoul flight. The plane apparently was seized by Red agents and forced to land at Pyongyang.

The Communists first claimed the 34 persons had defected to North Korea. Then they offered to negotiate their return with the governments concerned.

Wood Alcohol Toll Hits 23

NEW YORK (AP)—The death toll from wood alcohol poisoning here has reached 23 in a little more than a week. Twenty-one other persons are under hospital treatment as suspected victims.

Police in the Bronx and East Harlem, where all the deaths have been reported, said the source of the illegal drink has not yet been discovered but that they hoped actual case stopped days ago.

Detectives are confiscating and analyzing every pint of illegal alcohol they can find, hoping this may lead to the poison.
