Sacramento Valley: Variable cloudiness today except rain late today near Red Bluff, spreading to entire valley tonight; clearing Thursday after a few morning showers; colder Thursday; high today 58-65, Thursday 52-57; low tonight 38-45; variable winds 10-15 m.p.h. becoming northerly 15-30 m.p.h. late tonight and Thursday.

Northwestern California: Rain beginning northern portions during day and spreading to entire area tonight; clearing and slightly colder Thursday except a few scattered showers likely early in day; high today and low tonight Napa 62-64, Ukiah 62-64, Santa Rosa 64-64; coastal winds west or southwest 15-25 m.p.h. today becoming northwesterly 15-30 m.p.h. late tonight and Thursday.
