

Once Around The Training Camps

TUCSON, Ariz. — Righthander Stan Pitula of the Cleveland Indians will be laid up about two months as the result of a torn elbow muscle suffered Wednesday while pitching in an intrasquad game.

The injury was a recurrence of one he suffered last July, which put him on the disabled list for the remainder of the season.

"Call it a curve ball muscle," said Dr. Don Kelly, the Indians' physician. "It's the muscle that takes the strain when a pitcher throws a curve. It'll take about two months to heal."

MESA, Ariz. — Because of impressive work in training camp games, Chicago Cubs rookie pitcher Joe Schaffernoth will be used in Saturday's exhibition game against the Baltimore Orioles at Scottsdale.

The 6 foot, 4 21-year-old Schaffernoth, who has allowed only two runs in 15 innings in camp games, had a 9-12 record at Des Moines last season.

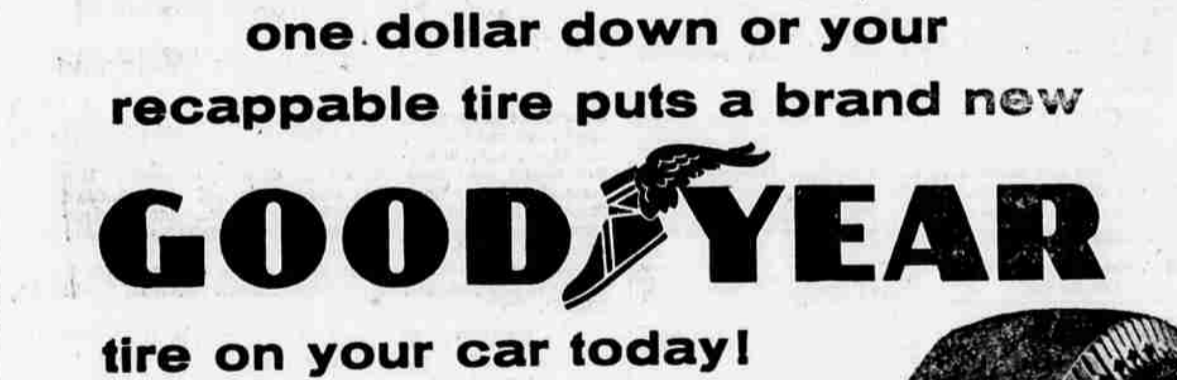

Top Pros Tee Off Open Play

NEW ORLEANS (UP) — The nation's top pro golfers teed off today in the first round of the \$20,000 Greater New Orleans Open Tournament—the first PGA tournament in New Orleans in the past 10 years.

Winds up to 25 miles per hour and rains were expected to handicap the first day scores for the 72-hole tournament after a week of balmy temperatures and sunshine.

Top money winners and the 60 top scorers in the Baton Rouge Open were automatically qualified.

TAMPA, Fla. — White Sox management voiced concern after a doctor's suggestion Wednesday that outfielder Al Smith remain out of uniform for perhaps 10 days because of a sore ankle.

An examination in Chicago last week indicated that Smith's ailment was not serious. However, on returning to Tampa, Smith again complained and further examination disclosed Smith was suffering from a bone deposit which inflamed the tendon of the right ankle.

PHOENIX, Ariz. — Three rookies, Andre Rodgers, Jim Davenport and Bob Schmidt, hit homers Wednesday in the San Francisco Giants' intrasquad game.

The first two went over the left field fence. Davenport's was inside the park on a hit misjudged by Bobby Thomson in center field.

VERO BEACH, Fla. — The pitching was not as sensational in the Los Angeles Dodgers' first intrasquad game, but manager Walt Alston says it's about what he expected.

"Before the game I told them that we weren't going to judge the pitching," Walt said after Peewee Reese's team dropped Ruben Walker's 6-3 in a nine-inning go. "I didn't want anybody to bear down and come up with a sore arm. I was more interested in hitting and running."

CLEARWATER, Fla. — Unseasonable weather is hampering spring drills of the Philadelphia Phillies and manager Mayo Smith is concerned.

"I've never seen anything like this," said Smith. "It just means we aren't going to be able to do a lot of the specialized work we had planned."

LAKELAND, Fla. — The Detroit Tigers are pleased with their first look at Billy Martin at shortstop and Harvey Kuenn in center field.

Kuenn, the ex-shortstop moved out because of fielding trouble, played seven innings in center-field Wednesday in the club's first intrasquad game. He had one single in four at-bats and handled two chances perfectly.

Martin, who has made only brief appearances as a shortstop, was even more impressive. The fiery ex-Yankee batted out a home run to the opposite field, added a single and had no trouble with a pair of chances.

Palmer, who did not play in Monday's pro-am warmup to today's open, attracted a small gallery as he fired practice rounds Tuesday and Wednesday. So did Ventura, Frank Stranahan and Don Hill.

Freddie Hans Jr., of New Orleans, who lost the last New Orleans Open by one stroke in 1948, was also a strong favorite. Hans wound up in fifth position at the Baton Rouge Open. The course record for the New Orleans City Park, 276, was set by Henry Picard in 1941.

The biggest practice round gallery went to ragsie George Boyer, playing out of San Gabriel, Calif., who consistently slammed out drives 300 yards plus across the lagoon-dotted course.

Officials at the city park course said the fairways are in excellent condition considering the freak snowstorm here last month. Some bare patches and low lies have been circled, where players may move the ball out of the circles, but winter rules will not be observed.

Under the rules the field will be trimmed to 60 players after 36 holes. Finals for the 18-hole-a-day affair will be Sunday.

Back tees on three holes, in use only for the tournament, increased the overall length of the course from 6600 to 6800 yards.

Missing from the ranks of touring pros was Jimmy Demaret, of Kiamasha Lake, N. Y., who left the circuit after defending his 1957 Baton Rouge title. Demaret, complaining of a touch of influenza during the Baton Rouge meet, left for Houston, where he is developing a golf course.
