Actress Issues New Charge At Mate In Kidnap Case

CINCINNATI — Now the report of a death threat has entered into the confusing Marie McDonald kidnap case.

Los Angeles officers said here last night the curvaceous 34-year-old screen actress told them her claim Wednesday that her estranged husband, millionaire Harry Karl, engineered the kidnaping came after she had received an anonymous telephone call. She said it was from a man who referred to the kidnaping and threatened her life.

After a long questioning period, Los Angeles Detective Lt. Herman Zander said Miss McDonald's charges against her husband "appear to be consistent" with her first story of the kidnaping.

It was a little more than a year ago that the blonde Miss McDonald reported she had been kidnapped by two men, held captive for 24 hours and then released on the desert 150 miles from her Encino, Calif., home.

A grand jury investigation at which Miss McDonald testified failed to bring any charges.

Wednesday, Miss McDonald, currently appearing in a northern Kentucky night club, told a press

Art Show Set For Churchill

NEW YORK — An exhibit of 40 paintings by Sir Winston Churchill opens today at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

The one-man art show runs through March 30. It is free.

At a preview, invitation-only benefit by the English-Speaking Union last night, presidential assistant Sherman Adams told the several hundred guests that the paintings add another dimension to the understanding of one of the great figures of the times.

Adams paid tribute to the 83-year-old statesman-painter.

Among British officials who attended the preview were Sir Harold Caccia, ambassador to the United States, and Sir Pierson Dixon permanent representative to the United Nations.

President Eisenhower, another amateur painter, wrote the foreword to the exhibit catalogue. In Sir Winston's consent for the display, Eisenhower found "a signal compliment . . . to our country."

Most of the canvases being shown are on loan from Sir Winston or members of his family. A few have been lent by private collectors to whom he has presented examples of his work.

The exhibit is touring a number of American museums. The Smithsonian Institution arranged the tour.

Cancer Cure Study Related

WASHINGTON — The Veterans Administration said today some of its researchers had uncovered evidence "that could point the way toward development of a vaccine for treatment of some types of cancer."

The announcement indicated, however, that there is no certainty of such a development. It said studies are being continued in the hope of discovering an anticancer weapon of that type.

The VA said the work is being done by doctors at its hospital in McKinney, Tex. It quoted Dr. Russell H. Wilson of that hospital as saying the research "indicates the existence of a natural defense mechanism of the body against cancer, the same type of body reaction which makes vaccine against polio and other diseases possible."

The announcement said findings indicate that, under certain circumstances, products from cancer cells may cause the body to produce substances—perhaps antibodies—which may travel through the blood stream and attack the cancer cells.

"Dr. Wilson said the researchers are pursuing these findings in the hope of discovering a way to activate this reaction to an extent that would be useful in destroying some types of malignant growth," the VA said.

The researchers were said to be working both with test tube tissue cultures and with patients who volunteered for the studies.

Communist Chief Reported Ailing

BUDAPEST, Hungary — A Hungarian government spokesman said today that Communist party chief Janos Kadar is ill but "not seriously." He gave no details.

Kadar missed a meeting yesterday of top Communists organized by the party Central Committee. Party Secretary Gyula Kallai explained before giving a report on his recent trip to Romania with Kadar that he was deputizing because of the party leader's "illness."

Red-Jap Trade Pact Outlined

HONG KONG — A Japanese trade delegation said today the \$80-million-dollar trade agreement signed with Red China includes some machinery and other items on the embargo list.

Chairman Masanosuke Ikeda did not name the items or give their value.

The agreement includes a memorandum which would permit Red China to open a permanent trade mission in Tokyo and fly her flag over it.

Japanese Premier Nobusuke Kishi indicated the flag provision would be unlikely to get his government's approval because it might be construed as diplomatic recognition of the Peiping regime.

Ikeda said failure to meet the memorandum provisions would nullify the trade agreement.
