### Death Claims Princess, 79

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP)—Princess Ingeborg of Sweden, the daughter, sister, mother-in-law and grandmother of kings, was found dead in bed today. She was 79.

One of the most popular members of Scandinavian royalty, Princess Ingeborg was the daughter of King Frederick VIII of Denmark and her brother became King Christian X on their father's death. The princess was married in 1897 to the late Prince Carl, a younger brother of the Swedish King. Their youngest daughter was the late Queen Astrid of Belgium, mother of King Baudouin. Their second daughter was the late Crown Princess Martha of Norway, whose widower became King Olav V last year.
