RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP)—A jury has decreed death in the San Quentin Prison gas chamber for a former German war bride. Mrs. Felicitas Nicholson, 32, convicted of beating her 5-year-old daughter to death last July, took the verdict calmly yesterday. The same jury that convicted her last Friday of first-degree murder met again, under a new California law, to fix the punishment.

Thriller Killer Set To Leave Prison After 33 Year Stay

JOLIET, Ill. (AP)—Nathan Leopold was ready to step into the world of free men today, 33 1/2 years after he entered prison for one of the nation's most publicized crimes. After a secret meeting with relatives in Chicago, he plans to fly to Puerto Rico for a \$10-a-month job as a laboratory worker in a mission hospital. The Illinois Parole and Pardon Board approved his request to take the job, thus authorizing his release on parole for five years. He was officially granted the parole last month but his release was delayed pending investigation of job offers.

Noted French Author Weds

PARIS (AP)—Francoise Sagan, 22-year-old writer of best-selling sexy novels, today married her 42-year-old publisher, Guy Schoeller. The author of stories about broken marriages and illicit love against a gay Riviera background was married by the mayor of a shabby section of Paris. The couple will live in a more elegant part of town. The young novelist said just two days ago there would be no marriage until next week. To avoid being mobbed by crowds of French bobbysoxers and newsmen she had tried from the start to throw confusion into her plans. When asked to name the day, she had usually quoted the French title of her third book, "In a Month, in a Year." Her three books, her script for a ballet with a daring bathroom scene, and her fast driving which almost killed her last year have made Miss Sagan a symbol of fast-living French youth. Most of the romantic affairs in her fiction are between young girls and older men, and while critics have been increasingly cool to her recent productions, they continue to sell furiously on both sides of the Atlantic.

Elvis Leaves For Home Visit

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Elvis Presley left for home last night after a surprise party at a studio upon finishing his last movie before he enters the Army. The rock 'n' roll singer's co-star, Dolores Hart, Director Michael Curtiz and the rest of the cast of "King Creole" attended the party in the Paramount studio commissary. Elvis left to visit with his family in Memphis, Tenn., before donning his uniform later this month.

Apology Issued By Air Force Over Bomb Dropping Incident

FLORENCE, S.C. (AP)—The Air Force has apologized to this tobacco community of 30,000 for the accidental dropping of an unarmed atomic bomb. The atomic portion of the bomb did not go off, but its TNT trigger exploded, blowing up a house and digging a crater 40 feet wide. In Washington, Secretary of Defense McElroy confirmed that the area was uncontaminated by radioactivity. Air Force crews were at work removing scars left by the explosion when the bomb accidentally fell from a B-47. Mayor David McLeod at City Hall got an apology for the incident from Maj. Gen. Charles B. Dougher of Hunter AFB, Ga., the bomber's base. High-ranking officers and claims personnel toured the two-mile-square area surrounding the impact point near the shattered Walter Gregg house five miles east of here. Gregg, his wife, their three children and a niece were injured, none seriously. Air Force authorities explained the bomb did not set off a nuclear explosion because it lacked the complete triggering device. The accidental bomb release was attributed to malfunctioning equipment. McElroy said a "high level" investigation has been ordered into the "wider implications of this unfortunate occurrence. . . . He, too, expressed deep regret to the six injured. The Hunter base identified three veteran captains as crew members of the bomber—Capt. Earl E. Koehler, about 36, Mount Carmel, Ill.; Capt. Charles S. Woodruff, 35, Van Wert, Ohio; and Capt. Bruce M. Kulka, 29, New York City. In London, the incident quickened concern in Parliament over possible nuclear devastation by accident from American-controlled weapons. A few curiosity-seekers came forward with bomb fragments they carried off as souvenirs. Xavier Cugat, noted leader of Latin American type of orchestras, was once staff cartoonist for "The Los Angeles Times."
