## Church Bills Missionary

The Rev. Donald Bitsberger, Episcopal missionary on the Japanese island of Kyuse Kyushu, will speak at the morning service at St. Paul's Episcopal Church Sunday, March 16.

The Rev. and Mrs. Bitsberger, with an extended tour in this country, have been serving in Japan with headquarters at Fukuoka since 1954. In addition to parochial duties, the couple has acted as representatives of Church World Service in distributing large quantities of relief goods to thousands of persons made homeless by floods on Kyushu.

Mrs. Bitsberger has also taught several classes in the United States Information Service Center in the city, and has assisted International Social Service in adoption cases involving Japanese-American orphans.

The Rev. and Mrs. Bitsberger will return to Japan later this spring for another three year term. They will continue their earlier work and in addition the pastor will take responsibility for the student work of the YMCA in Kyushu University.
