Camp Easter Seal Draws National Acclaim For Aid

Camp Easter Seal, Oregon's summer camp specially designed for crippled children and young adults, is attracting nationwide attention, according to Ernest M. Jachetta, Portland attorney and president of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults, which operates the camp.

Persons interested in a similar camp for the crippled children in their home states have visited the camp and watched it in operation and countless mail inquiries have been received from eastern and middlewestern states, Jachetta reported.

Camp Easter Seal "fills a very definite need for Oregon's crippled children," Jachetta stated. "It gives them a psychological 'lift' to know they can go camp like other youngsters and also affords their parents an opportunity to relax at home."

Located on picturesque Coos Lake of Ten Mile Lake in Coos County, Camp Easter Seal covers 80 acres and has all the natural resources for a camp, including water for swimming, boating and fishing. All buildings are designed to make it easy for youngsters in wheel chairs, on crutches and wearing braces to move around.

The regular staff includes a registered nurse, three practical nurses from the hospital in Coos Bay and an activities staff of trained camp leaders.

There are four 10-day sessions each summer and each session is divided into age groups so they will be compatible. The final session is for young adults. Jachetta explained that seriously crippled children can be accompanied by a friend or relative.

The camp is one of several projects of the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults which is staging its annual Easter Seal sale at this time. Sale of Easter Seal is the prime source of revenue for the society.

Indians Seek Trespass Law

WASHINGTON - Indians from Washington, Idaho and Oregon asked Congress Friday for authority to block hunters and fishermen from trespassing on reservation lands.

Delegations headed by Frank George of Nespelem, Wash., a member of the Confederated Colville Tribes, testified before a House judiciary subcommittee urging support of bills by Heps, Magnuson (D-Wash.) and Horan (D-Wash.).

"The proposed legislation would 'make it unlawful to destroy, deface or remove certain boundary markers on Indian reservations, and to trespass on Indian reservations to hunt, fish or trap.'"

Much of the testimony revolved around hunting and fishing trespass provisions, which carry a maximum penalty of \$500 fine and six months in jail.

George told the committee only about 10 per cent of non-Indian fishermen who fish in Colville reservation waters obtain the tribe's \$2 license. The Indians use the permits in cooperation with Washington State to maintain fish stocks in reservation waters.

The Spokane and Quinault tribes of Washington, the Nez Perce of Idaho and the Warm Springs Confederated Tribes and Klamaths of Oregon were represented at the hearing.

Missiles May Be Visible

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. - Subject to weather conditions, Russia's Sputnik II and its American counterpart, Explorer I, may be visible over sections of the United States during the next few days, the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory reports.

The observatory announced Friday that the Russian dog carrying satellite may be seen in the twilight hours of both morning and evening on Sunday and Monday, while Explorer I continues to whirl across the southern belt of the country in west-east direction.

Sputnik II, which is expected to plunge to earth about April 14, may be observed traveling north northwest to south southeast in the morning and south southwest to north northeast in the evening.

Because of its size, Explorer I is much more difficult to spot than Sputnik II. The American satellite is about 80 inches long compared to the Soviet version which is possibly 35 feet in length.

MEETING - The Communists have called a meeting of the military Armistice Commission for Monday, possibly to hand over a U.S. fighter pilot shot down March 6 by Red ground fire over the Korean demilitarized zone. They agreed last Monday to return the pilot, Capt. Leon Pfeiffer of Kenosha, Wis., but they did not say when.

Wilder, although handicapped by the loss of an arm, has had experience in sports. His left arm brought him national fame in 1930 when he was a four letter man at Chemawa High School, and was mentioned in Ripley's "Believe It Or Not" for his athletic prowess. He was one of the original tournament committee that started the All-Indian tournament and worked with it for two years.

He is chairman of the Boy Scout committee in the Fort Klamath area. He has also coached a group of youngsters in tribal Indian dancing.

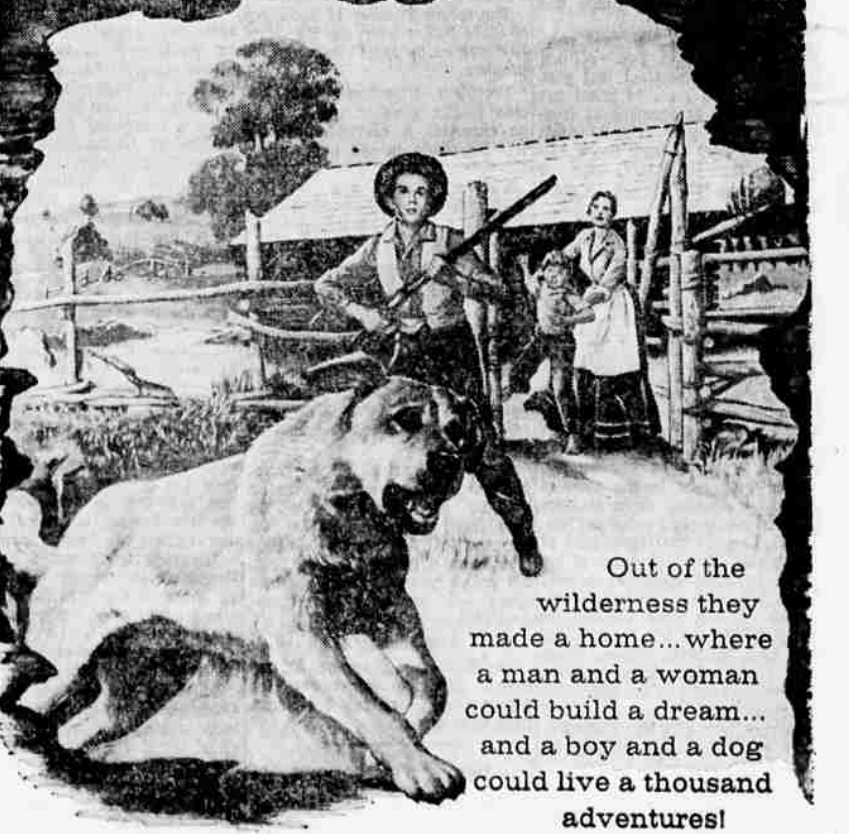
