Pittsburgh Chief Lawrence Seeking State Leadership

MARRISBURG, Pa. (UP) — David L. Lawrence, Pittsburgh's long-time mayor and the power behind the throne in the only two Democratic reigns Pennsylvania has had in 50 years, is now out to be governor himself.

As the state's Mr. Democrat for more than 20 years, Lawrence, 66, is picked by most experts to run away with the party's nomination in the May 29 primary.

His principal opponent is Lt. Gov. Roy E. Furman, 57, who broke with the Leader administration when the governor tried unsuccessfully to block a Republican Legislature from passing a three per cent sales tax.

Outer Space Venture Ends

NORFOLK, Va. "I feel good . . . man can survive in space."

With these sentiments, the Navy's Lt. Cmdr. Jack Neiman Jr., yesterday ended a pioneer venture into simulated outer space.

The time was 10:10 a. m.—44 hours to the minute after Neiman had been sealed in a pressure chamber at the Norfolk Naval Air Station for exposure to conditions of altitudes up to 105,000 feet.

Clad in a new, lightweight space suit, Neiman set a record for endurance under circumstances that could have meant almost instant death had anything gone wrong.

The Navy said his stay in the enormously complex pressure chamber provided enough information "to forecast the effects of space flight on man for days, weeks, or a month."

The visible effects on Neiman were negligible. He lost two pounds. The inflated suit rubbed blisters on his wrists and irritated his neck. His boots were too tight and had to be changed.

Neiman left the pressure chamber four hours short of the Navy's original 48-hour goal, but Cmdr. A. L. Hall, medical officer in charge of the experiment, said there was no need for continuing it longer.

As it was, Neiman added nearly 24 hours to the previous record for endurance in a similar earth-bound space flight—a mark of 20 hours, 24 minutes set in April by the Navy in San Diego, Calif.

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Diplomat's Girl Knifed

NEW YORK (UP)—The 16-year-old daughter of Iran's chief United Nations delegate was cut on the hand with a penknife in an attack by two teen-aged girls in Bronx Park.

The girl's dress was ripped in the attack, which occurred Saturday evening, police disclosed last night.

Police said Frieda Abdoh was walking with a sister, Masti, 12, in the park while their father, Dr. Djilal Abdoh, and his wife sat in a restaurant.

Frieda and Masti decided to walk along a brook and climb a hill. Frieda told police that as she helped Masti up the steep incline she noticed two Negro girls staring at them. The girls were about 16 or 17. One had a knife strapped to her leg.

One girl tossed a light bulb on the ground. It exploded near Frieda and her sister.

Frieda turned to remonstrate. After an exchange of words, the knife wielder began ripping at Frieda's skirt.

When Frieda and her sister began to cry, the girls fled. Masti was not hurt.

Abdoh and his wife took their daughters home after making a report to police.

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Southern Nevada, Las Vegas Growth Spectacular

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — An engineer from California describes the growth of Las Vegas and Southern Nevada as "rapid and spectacular."

Testifying yesterday in the Colorado River suit as Nevada's fifth witness, James M. Montgomery of Pasadena noted that more and more Americans are taking up desert living.

He said it's not "the bugaboo" it once was, "Air conditioning has made desert living attractive and comfortable."

For example, Montgomery said that by the year 2000 the population of Las Vegas will swell to more than a half million.

Southern Nevada has all the elements needed for industrial growth, such as water, power, mild climate, raw materials and transportation facilities, he said.
