## Network Crowds Emotions Into TV Play

NEW YORK (AP)—All the passion, frustration and revenge of "Wuthering Heights" were crowded into 90 minutes of television when "Show of the Month" (CBS-TV) presented its adaptation of the Emily Bronte novel. It was too much for the small screen.

If one believed the evidence of television on Friday evening, "Wuthering Heights" is little more than soap opera. If one believes the evidence of millions of readers in the past 110 years, it is much more. What happened in its trans-

lation to television? Miss Bronte wrote a tragedy. She shocked Victorian readers by introducing to English fiction the first heroine who loved passionately instead of being merely loved. She developed a theme of conflict between passion and reason.
