Joyce and her husband Dewey H. Leavitt came to Lakeview in May 1957 and made their home on the Bradley Ranch.

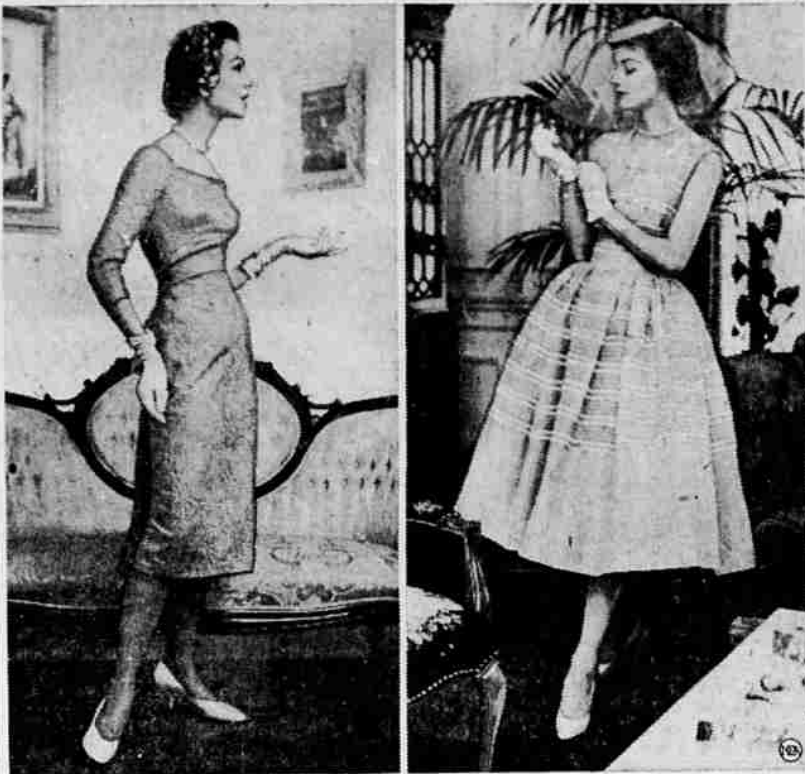
In September of '57 Mrs. Leavitt went to work as a clerk-typist in the Fremont office. For the past few months she has been adult clerk.

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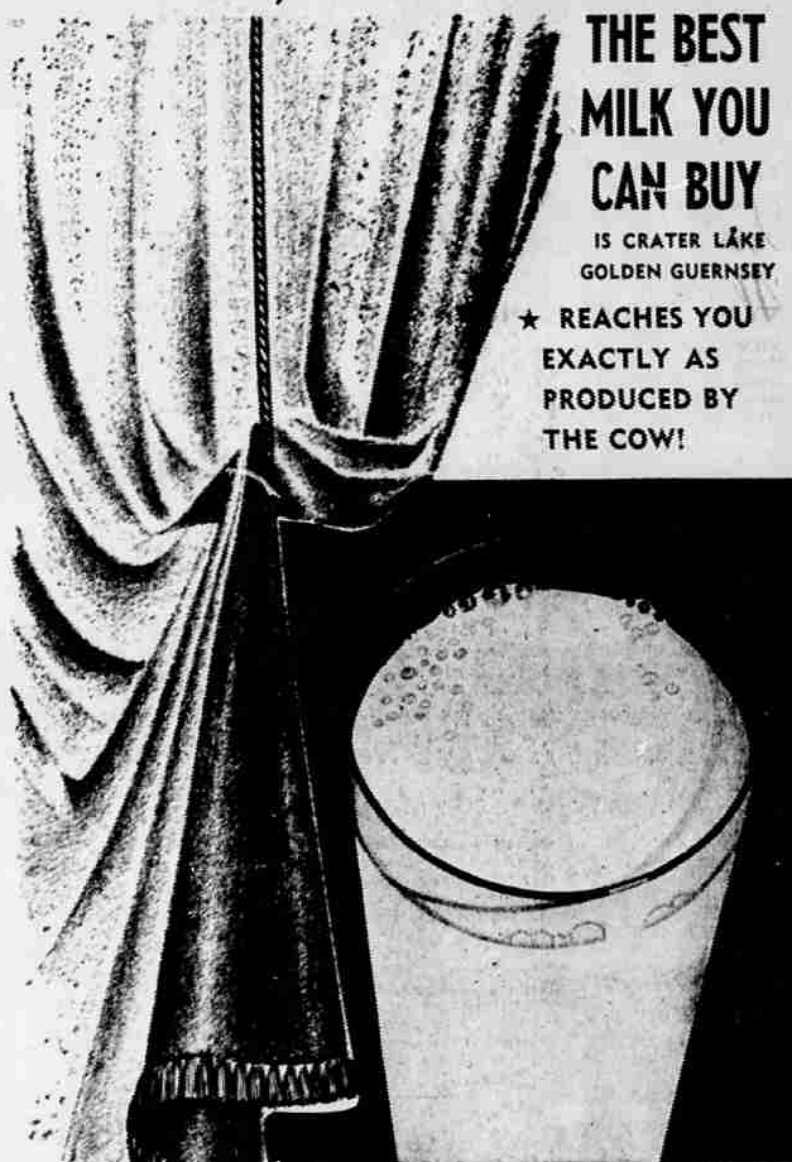
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
