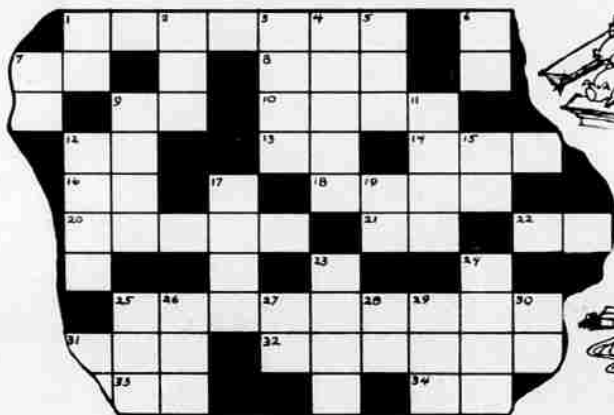
away. Other couples in the game do the same. Then, at a starting signal, all the couples run toward the other line, half of them running backwards. When they
