Tugs Refloat Stranded Ship

HONG KONG—Four tugs today refloated the passenger freighter President Hayes, perched for a week on a coral reef off the Parcel Islands with 71 Americans aboard.
The liner severely damaged her hull when she grounded 400 miles southeast of Hong Kong, stranding her 12 passengers and 59 crewmen.
The vessel was en route from Hong Kong to Saigon. She is being returned here for drydock inspection.

Manufacturers Group Issues Ethics Guidebook

NEW YORK—The National Assn. of Manufacturers has issued an ethics guidebook for management.

The guidebook, released yesterday, mentions the AFL-CIO code of ethics for organized labor.

A spokesman for the manufacturers' association said the standards for industry represent policies that have been part of the association's principles for many years.

He made it clear there is no thought of setting up any policing machinery to enforce the code.

The spokesman said the association has absolutely no control over the policies of the companies which are members.

U.S. Senate racket investigators have been studying corruption in union-management relations for more than a year.

A foreword to the manufacturers' association pamphlet says both industry and labor have "obligations to the general public, to people as individuals and to the nation's economy, which should be recognized and, when necessary, given precedence over their own organizational interests."

The manufacturers' code calls for fairness by employers in all dealings with workers, customers, creditors and suppliers. It warns that all forms of monopoly, whether practiced by capital, labor or government, are detrimental to the public interest.

The association says a worker has a right to join or refuse to join a union, and it calls for protection of this choice. It urges that collective bargaining be conducted in good faith and that both sides seek to make the negotiations fruitful.

The code urges employers to use all means in their control to stabilize employment and foster productive efficiency as a means of guaranteeing good wages and steady jobs.

It denounces mass picketing

and "monopolistic combinations by labor unions, with or without employer concurrence."

The manufacturers' guidebook contains a synopsis of the ethics code adopted by the AFL-CIO, which deals with such topics as financial honesty in the conduct of

union affairs, union internal democracy and the exclusion of racketeers from leadership.

The manufacturers' pamphlet presents the labor code without editorial comment. But a concluding paragraph in the digest said: "No codes have yet been adopted

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by the AFL-CIO which deal with individuals who constitute its membership. As time goes on, it is likely that employers, to the extent to be hoped such codes will be any of the nation or to the in-developed."
