Man, Wife In Auto Headon

BRIDGETON, N.J. — A young shoe clerk and his wife, each in a separate car, sped toward a quiet country crossroads called Harmony last night.

They met in a flaming broadside crash that swept the two autos against an empty house.

Police were able to pull Lester Wright, 19, from the pyre, but he was dead by the time they got him to Bridgeton Hospital.

His wife Vera, also 19, was hurled from her borrowed car and is in serious condition at the hospital with a possible skull fracture.

What brought the couple, married a year and a half, to the lonely intersection at twilight?

Police can only hope to question the young widow, who is still in deep shock. They also seek Walter Robinson, who they say owned the car she drove on a learner's permit.

Mrs. Wright's auto hurtled into the left side of her husband's car, sent it slicing through a pole and into a porch. Her car smashed into the foundation. "Both were alone."

Police theorize they might have intended to turn into the road which leads to Bridgeton, where they lived.

Ketch Off On Expedition

LONG BEACH, Calif. — A 61-foot ketch heads into the Pacific this Wednesday to retrace the route of scientist Charles Darwin 122 years ago.

The expedition will spend a year in underwater exploration. Its leader hopes the undertaking will add to the research Darwin did for his "Origin of the Species."

The ketch Chiriqui will carry seven men, headed by Lowell Thompson, 42-year-old Spokane, Wash., geologist and mining engineer.

Thompson calls this "The Darwin Expedition" and says that in general it will follow the path Darwin described in "The Voyage of The Beagle."

"We have many advantages Darwin didn't have," said Thompson. "Every one of us is a skin diver. Darwin had to depend upon second hand observations of sea life."

He says he has \$100,000 tied up in the venture.

The expedition is taking miles of film. A full length movie, much of it taken under water, is one of its projects.

Pharmaceutical houses have provided a power-propelled spear, into which has been built a special hypodermic. Loaded with curare, a poison from the amazon jungles, the spear will be shot at sharks.

Scripps Institute of Oceanography, at LaJolla, Calif., is interested in the effects of curare on sharks. Scripps also is interested in poisonous shellfish to be collected by the crew.

For UCLA scientists, the expedition will send back whole schools of small fish from the Tuamoto archipelago.

The skipper is Lorenzo (Plazi) Miller, 23, of Palos Verdes, Calif.

Billy Graham To Testify Before Senate Committee

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Evangelist Billy Graham will testify Thursday in a State Assembly Subcommittee investigation into the sale of pornographic books in the San Francisco area.

Assemblyman Louis Francis (R-San Mateo) announced the evangelist's appearance. He had a subpoena served on Graham last week.

"Billy said he would be an enthusiastic and willing witness," Francis said. "He will testify on

the effect of immoral suggestions on youth."

Earlier, Graham had announced he would not be able to testify before the first week in July. He also has said he never has seen any pornographic material in his life.

An Arkansas evangelist, the Rev. Braxton B. Sawyer, said he was sending Graham 20 pounds of pornography by air express so he could see what it is like. Indications were the shipment would be refused.

Meanwhile, Graham resumed his crusade Tuesday night after a day's rest. He told a crowd of 13,000 at the Cow Palace that the price of salvation comes high, but the price of sin is even greater — eternal death.

"Because God gave his only son to save you," he said, "salvation will cost you your selfishness, your pride, your lust."

"You must give all to Christ — your emotion, personality and heart."

Earlier, Graham told a crowd of 1200 students at San Francisco State College they must change the heart and soul of man so that he will love instead of hate. That, he said, is the only course to avoid worldwide destruction.

The students attending the special address filled three auditoriums to hear him. They applauded frequently. Halfway through his address, a group of students raised a large banner reading, "Billy, what about H-bomb tests?"

"Thanks for suggesting the top-

ic," Graham said affably. There was no sign of a controversy that earlier split students and faculty members over his appearance. Some faculty members objected to his speaking on grounds that violated the separation of church and state.

India Train Jumps Tracks; 20 Killed

BOMBAY, India — A crowded express train jumped the track at high speed 400 miles north-west of Bombay early Wednesday, killing 20 persons and injuring 50, the state-owned railway announced.

The crash occurred on the Western Railway. The official report said seven coaches derailed and two of them overturned.

The express was en route from Rajkot to Viramgam.
