**Directors Plan To Attend Meet**

Lee Holliday of Klamath Falls, president; Murel Long of Lower Klamath, vice president; A. R. Campbell of Klamath Falls, W. M. Williams and Wilbur E. Harnsberger of Henley, J. Randall Pope of Merrill, and John V. Withers of Paisley, Oregon, all directors of the Klamath Production Credit Association, plan to attend the 1958 summer conference of PCA directors and secretary-treasurers at Portland, June 19 and 20.

Don W. Krider, secretary-treasurer of the Klamath association said the Portland meeting will bring together more than 50 farmers and ranchers, all directors of PCA's, representatives of the federal district farm credit boards, and officials of the Federal Intermediate Credit Bank of Spokane.

Discussion of administrative and operating problems of the associations and the bank, will highlight the two-day workshop session, according to Krider. A special feature will be the formulating of plans for observing the 25th anniversary of production credit service and the 35th anniversary of the credit bank. The anniversaries will be celebrated throughout a 12 month period starting July 1, 1958.

The credit bank, organized in 1923, is a wholesaler of credit and the chief source of PCA loan funds, Krider explained. The PCA's are now in the process of buying out the government's investment in the bank.

**Kingsley Field Activates 11-Point Safety Program**

An 11 point traffic safety program with the overall objective of reducing private motor vehicle accidents in the Western Air Defense Force by 35 per cent was put in motion at Kingsley Field last week with a kick-off luncheon at Reames Country Club.

Lt. Col. Raymond A. Thornton, Kingsley Field Base commander, stated that "This accelerated traffic safety program was set in motion because of the increased driving accident rate noted Air Force wide, and the resulting severe manpower loss to the Air Force."

The 11 points of the WADF Traffic Safety Program as outlined at the luncheon by Colonel Thornton are (1) conduct a special safety program during the period May 15 through September 15; (2) insure active participation by all personnel; (3) create favorable public relations by participation in community and state safety programs; (4) emphasis on environment with an objective approach based upon geographic, climatic, equipment, and driver's physical condition; (5) driver improvement program with increased emphasis on a 10 hour driver course for all airmen under 25 years of age; (6) require reports by personal contact on all accidents within five days; (7) improve control of violations by arranging for traffic citation and accident reports from state, county and community officials; (8) arrange for specialized off-duty training and disciplinary action for repeat violators; (9) require the inspection of private vehicles to insure mechanical safety; (10) reemphasize the responsibility of supervisory personnel; and, (11) provide safety for all by complete integration of this 11 point safety program into all daily activities.

Attending the luncheon and offering their full support and cooperation with the WADF Eleven Point Program were Mayor Lawrence E. Slater; Charles B. Bane, president of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce; Judges Charles Mack and Frank Blackmer; Police Chief J. H. Howard; Capt. F. E. Winchell, California Highway Patrol; Sgt. Bruce Latten, Oregon State Police as well as other civilian and military members of the Traffic Safety Committee.
