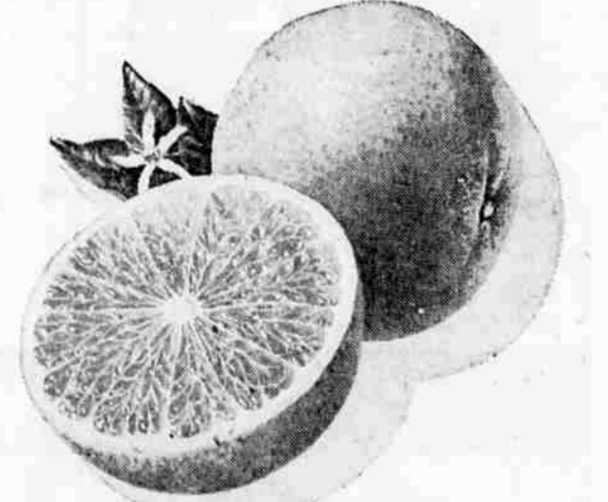

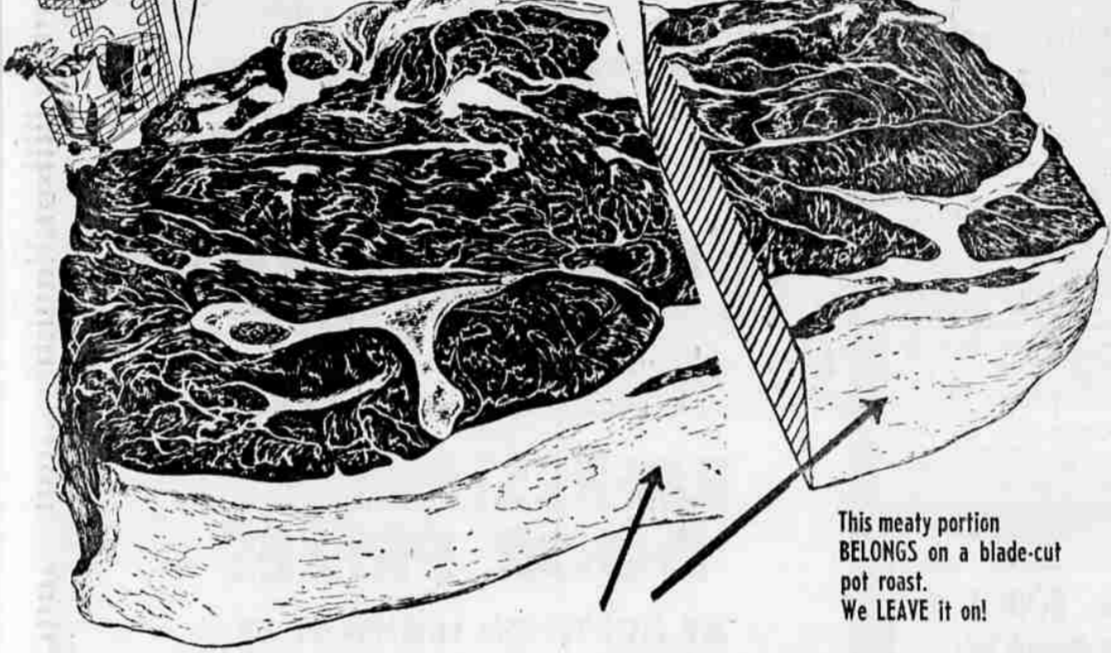

The quick success of the bid for power by disgruntled generals and French settlers has given their leaders a heavy sense of mission to shock France into wiping out its bickering, blundering political system and again make the nation a vigorous world power.

Long-time students of the Algerian question find it difficult to see where it all will end. Confusion heaped upon paradox obscures the immediate future.

Some pressing questions have called "The Revolution of May 13." That was the day Algerians rioted against the possibility that new Premier Pierre Pflimlin might seek negotiations to end the Algerian war.

Some Europeans explain the Arab participation this way: "They finally see the French are here to stay, that French policy finally is consistent and strong. Now they know we mean business, and they want to join us."
