COLUMBUS, Ohio (UP) — An Ernie Pyle Memorial Library was dedicated at Ohio State University here Friday to the famous Scripps-Howard war correspondent killed in the closing days of World War II.

A \$4,000 grant from the Scripps-Howard Memorial Fund made the library possible.

Another Scripps-Howard foreign correspondent, Jim Lucas, was to be the principal speaker at a noon lunch arranged by George Kienzle, director of the Ohio State University school of journalism.

Lucas' topic was the Orient. Friday night he will address the annual "Rih-n-roast" dinner sponsored by the university journalism students.

Special guests at the dedication included university president Neville G. Fawcett; Columbus Citizen Editor Don E. Weaver; City Editor Pat Phelan; Haskell Short, manager of the United Press Columbus Bureau; and representatives of other Scripps-Howard and other Ohio newspapers.

## Sullivan To Present Review Of His TV Career June 22

NEW YORK (UP) — To review kinescopes of Ed Sullivan's CBS-TV shows of the past 10 years is to watch the fascinating cavalcade of show business through a decade.

The viewing audience will have that opportunity June 22 on the tenth anniversary of the show. As part of the celebration Sullivan also will present the Brussels World's Fair on film June 15 in a program narrated by Maurice Chevalier.

Sullivan leaves for Brussels by plane immediately after his program next Sunday (8 p.m., EDT) to film performances at the Fair and—great contrast — to film such great battlefields in the area as Waterloo, Liege, Mons and Bastogne.

"Belgium has been one of the world's great battlegrounds," he said. "Now, at the Fair, it's the site of an attempt at world cooperation."

## Actress Seeks Comeback After Period Of Blindness

HOLLYWOOD (UP) — Alice White, blonde star of the flaming age in the movies, is making a comeback after a period of blindness.

A year ago her sight was gone. She had been trimming the garden of her home near the heart of Hollywood. A ladder tipped. She was hurled to the ground. Her shears gashed her left eye horribly.

"The other eye lost its sight out of a sympathetic reaction," she recalled. "For six months I could do nothing but lie flat on my back. The slightest movement or excitement would upset my eyes. All I could do was listen to the radio and TV. Friends would read to me. Fortunately, I had a loyal bunch of friends who took care of me."

"It was pretty tough to be knocked out like that after leading such an active life. But I came through it somehow. And I think I learned a lot from it. My life isn't so frantic any more."

But she wants to get her career active again. Still pretty at 43, she shows none of the effects of her accident. Her eyes are back to normal, and she still has the bounce that made her a star in the early talkies.

Alice White, Clara Bow, Joan Crawford and Jean Harlow typified the emancipated female in movies of the 20s and early 30s. With her familiar milk-white bob, Miss White often played the jazz-struck doll, the gangsters' sweetheart or the madcap heiress.

Her kind of film faded from popular favor and her career went into a decline. Once wed to producer Sy Bartlett, she married writer John Roberts and followed him as he traveled during wartime service.

"I went domestic with a vengeance," she laughed. "I even went to school to learn how to cook. But I don't think it was such a good idea. I think men resent women who are too domestic."

Divorced again, she resumed her acting career, her last performance being a small role in Joan Crawford's "Flamingo Road" in 1949. Now rehired at "I think a woman looks kind

## Actor Says 'O' Extinct

LONDON (UP) — Stanley Holloway finds it's wonderful to hear the vowel "o" again after spending two years in the United States.

Holloway is the scandalous cockney Alfred P. Doolittle in "My Fair Lady," now playing in London.

"A proper 'o' is extinct in America," he says.

"For two years I heard 'hart' for 'hot' and people kept calling me 'Hallaway'."

"Now, every night after the show I step just outside and I'm right in Covent Garden. I walk down The Long Acre and listen to the cockney fruit porters. I can freshen my accent and breathe in that atmosphere."

"The place is full of Doolittle characters and my wife tells me any one of them could play Alfred's part."

"A lot of us in the cast think the American audiences enjoy the cockney dialect better than the audiences over here. The English are accustomed to cockney and look down on it. It's newer to the Americans."

"Rex Harrison's opening song, 'Why can't the English teach their children how to speak?' isn't as good here as it was in America. The English don't like jokes about themselves the way Americans do."

Holloway lives west of London. Nearby are several fine courses where Holloway, Rex Harrison and the old British golf master Henry Cotton play.

"I've had a little bit o' luck — just a little bit o' luck," says Stanley.

## California Weather

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — Five-day weather forecast for Northern California: Scattered showers at beginning of period but little or no precipitation otherwise; temperatures near normal; normal minimum-maximum Sacramento 53-81, Red Bluff 57-84, Eureka 49-58; Santa Rosa 44-75, Blue Canyon 46-64.

SAN FRANCISCO (UP) — The weatherman forecast scattered showers today over Northern and Central California, followed by gradual clearing Saturday.

The showers came from a tropical type of storm which was 350 miles off the Central California Coast early today. The north state usually gets cold rains from storms sweeping down from Alaska.

A cloudburst deluged San Francisco and parts of Marin and San Mateo Counties, and the East Bay Thursday night, accompanied by a spectacular thunder and lightning display.

The brief fierce rain lifted man-hole covers into the air and cut off electricity to parts of Pacific Heights for an hour. One bolt of lightning struck a 65-foot mast of a sailboat at Yacht Harbor. It was undamaged.

The Weather Bureau said 60 inch of rain fell in San Francisco between 5 p.m. and 9:30 p.m. The cloudburst took place about 7 o'clock.

In Southern California, heavy rain caused at least six million dollars damage to the strawberry crop. Malcolm Douglas, manager of the California Strawberry Board in Los Angeles, said the rains destroyed 10 per cent of the crop. He said the damage would force suspension of volume shipments to eastern markets for at least a week.
