### Temperance Meeting Set

The Ministerial Association of Klamath Falls will cooperate with the Oregon Temperance League to present a seminar on alcohol education and the problems of alcoholism on Monday, May 26 at First Christian Church at Ninth and Pine streets. Sessions will begin at 10 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Dr. Titus A. Frazee, executive director of the Oregon Temperance League, will lead the seminar which is planned to meet the following needs: How to Better Understand the Alcoholic; How to Counsel with Him and His Family; The "Why" of Alcoholism, and How the Church May Meet the Challenge. Dr. Frazee is a member of the board of directors and executive committee of the National Temperance League, Fellow of the Yale University School of Alcohol Studies, and past lieutenant governor of Kiwanis International.

Melvin L. Derby, director of education for the league, will present the program of "Alcohol Education in the Public Schools" and will show the recent scientific films "Far From Alone," and "One In 20,000." Mr. Derby is a graduate of the University of Utah School of Alcohol Studies and a member of the National Institute for the Prevention of Alcoholism. He is a guest instructor on alcohol education for the Oregon public schools.

Rev. L. Dow Wright, president of the Klamath Falls Ministerial Association, will preside at the morning session and Rev. E. H. Glover will bring an opening devotional. Rev. Edward Hamme will preside at the afternoon session and Rev. Charles E. Myers will lead in the closing prayer. Pastor Otis R. Bell is in charge of arrangements.
